#### President's Patter

It was very sobering to listen to our special guest, Emma Price, at our October dinner meeting. Emma spoke so passionately about human trafficking and her work in Cambodia. As she reminded us, today there are some 35 million slaves in the world with 75% of these in SE Asia.

Emma worked teaching English in the SHE Rescue Home for girls who have been exploited. She spoke of the difficulties of safely reintegrating the girls back into their family and/or community, but that some 64 girls have been supported through the program with many being able to return home or to another support program.

Our own 16 days of action around raising awareness and advocacy of violence against women is progressing well. The Hon Dame Quentin Bryce AD CVO has agreed to launch our gn on Wednesday, 25 November 2015 at Riverbend Book Store in Oxford Street Bulimba. The support from both Dame Quentin Bryce and Suzi Wilson at Riverbend Books is greatly appreciated.

A number of businesses in Oxford Street have agreed to host a woman either inside their premises or at the entry. The aim is to create a visual image to raise awareness of violence against women as the public walk along Oxford Street.

Again it was a great privilege to induct Barbara Bolton-Hall into our Club at our last dinner meeting. In November, our District Governor, Judith Trevan-Hawke, will induct two more new members, Jane Gray and Virginia Evans.
