President's Patter



In the first week of November, Ros and I met with representatives across the Brisbane Zonta Clubs to finalise our upcoming action around the Zonta Says No Campaign. There are a lot of events planned. I hope members of our Club can join in some of these. This newsletter provides an overview of activities and dates particularly for the lighting of buildings and bridges across Brisbane.

I think the most exciting is the banner that will hang from the inbound side of the Story Bridge from the 13 to 26 November. Keep a watch out for this.

The statistics around domestic and family violence remain alarming. On average, at least one woman a week is killed by a partner or former partner in Australia (Our Watch). By some estimates only half the assaults are reported to police. What we know also is that this significant social problem is ultimately preventable.

The central elements of the Zonta Says No Campaign are the timing and the orange colour. The 16 days commence on the UN Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women and end on the 1 December, the UN Day for Human Rights.

The United Nations Secretary-General's Campaign UNITE to End Violence against Women proclaimed the 25th of each month as 'orange day', a day to raise awareness and take action against violence against women and girls. As a bright and optimistic colour, orange represents a future free from violence against women and girls.

I know we have spent time money and effort in this area now for a number of years but sadly it will take a concerted effort for a long period if we are to truly meet our goal - Eliminating Violence against Women.

We should all congratulate ourselves on this campaign and whilst we recognise the importance of raising awareness we should also understand it is critical to take action. Our projects and our contributions to Zonta International allow us an avenue to play a part in eliminating violence against women and children.

Zonta Says NO to Domestic Violence Campaign

25 November is the UN Day Against Domestic Violence and sees the official start of the annual 16 Days of Activism. As in past years, our Club will be quite visible during these 16 days. Activities include:

- Paint the Bayside Orange Breakfast (flyer attached)
- Placement of our "orange" silhouettes in prominent locations around our area with information about our Club and our "Safety Cards" with emergency numbers for people experiencing domestic violence;
- Regular updates on our Facebook page;
- ♦ Story and Victoria Bridges lit orange 20 -22 November;
- Kurilpa Walk Bridge lit orange 28 -30 November and on 1, 7, 8, 9, 10 December;
- ♦ King George Square & City Hall lit orange 19 -22 November;
- Sir Leo Hielscher Bridges lit orange 26 November to 10 December;
- Transurban will promote the ZSN Campaign on their website;

In addition Jo and Ros have been meeting with other Brisbane based Clubs to coordinate activities and raise the profile of the campaign.

With funding from District we have organised for a banner to be strung across the Story Bridge (inbound end) from 13—26 November.

Other Club activities include:

Brisbane Metro Breakfast:

- A Fellowship Walk around Brisbane when the Bridges are lit on 22 November commencing at 6.00pm and concluding with coffee in King George Square; and
- Large Zonta banner and "orange" lady at Southbank TAFE.

Brisbane North:

- Stall at Kenmore Village, Indooroopilly Shoppingtown and Brookside to promote ZSN; and
- Library displays.

Brisbane River:

• Orange women in West End area & PAH

Orange silhouettes will also be placed at a number of Brisbane Ferry Terminals eg Bulimba, Riverside, Eagle Street, Orleigh Park and Kangaroo Point. Other Clubs will assist with this and replenish information supplies held by each "lady".

United Nations Day

UN Day was celebrated on 24 October. The following is taken from the ZI website:



"Zonta International has cooperated with the United Nations since the UN was founded in 1945. Seventy-two years later, we are celebrating United Nations Day, which marks the anniversary of the UN Charter's entry into force in 1945.

Zonta International has had consultative status with the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) since 1969. In 1986, Zonta was accredited by ECOSOC with General Consultative Status, the highest status a non-governmental organization can hold.

We have representatives at UN locations in New York, Geneva, Vienna, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) in Paris and the Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP) in Bangkok.

Two years ago, the UN and its Member States passed the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development to transform the world into a better place for everyone. Zonta's emphasis is on Goal No. 5: Achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls.

Zonta is partnering with three UN agencies for our biennial international service and Zonta International Strategies to End Violence Against Women

(ZISVAW) projects, which all work toward achieving gender equality".
