Hi everybody and Happy New Year

Thank you all for the Christmas cards and New Year wishes. And what an exciting 1984 it's going to be for the Zontians here in District XVI. I hope those of you who attended the Brisbane conference had your appetites sufficiently whetted for more Zonta fellowship (this time on an International scale) and you are talking the rest of your club members into coming along to Sydney with you. Registration forms are now available so sign up now. If we could get 300 to Brisbane we should get 900 to Sydney. It's a once in a lifetime opportunity.

Brisbane Conference report is still being compiled but copies will be sent to each club in due course. Meanwhile you may care to note that the following resolutions were adopted:-

1. That where possible all meetings and social functions held by Zonta International be arranged at venues which are easily accessible to the disabled in recognition that there are members of Zonta International who have varied degrees of disablement.
2. That with the knowledge that nuclear war is unsurvivable in the short term and could make the world uninhabitable in the long term we urge Zontians to study ways of increasing international peace and understanding
3. That Area II now be divided into two Areas, one area to cover Victoria and Tasmania, the other to cover Western Australia, South Australia and the Northern Territory. (After convention Area II will cover Victoria and Tasmania and Area VI the others).
4. That one dollar per biennium be levied on all District members as a conference fee payable when membership fees are levied irrespective of the club's attendance at the conference.

The Zenith club resolution adopted at the District conference in 1979 has been again referred to the International Bylaws committee to be voted on at the Sydney convention. Time will be made available at the District meeting (preconvention) for the Zonta Club of Sydney to fully explain the recommendation to new clubs and refresh delegates' memories.

A recommendation has also gone forward that the subscription fee for the Zontian should be the same for all members regardless of where they live. If everyone paid at the same rate of say \$5.00 it would result in additional income of \$10,200.00.

AMELIA EARHART: This committee's purpose is to promote interest in the Amelia Earhart Fellowship Fund which recognises the contributions made by pioneering aviatrix, Amelia Earhart, to improving the status of women. Duties include promoting interest in the Amelia Earhart Fellowship Awards which are given to honor women who are studying science and engineering and participating in scientific and technological development.

ATTENDANCE: This committee, usually of one or two people, is responsible for keeping a record of attendance at all meetings and reporting to the secretary; encouraging regular attendance; receiving applications for leave of absence .

FINANCE: The Finance Committee exists to prepare an annual budget which is submitted to the Board before consideration by the club; devise plans for raising necessary funds; provide for an annual audit and report at the annual meeting.

INTERCITY: This committee keeps Brisbane North in touch with neighbouring Zonta Clubs to stimulate fellowship and to bring about closer relationships between nearby clubs.

FELLOWSHIP: As the name suggests, this committee has been established to promote fellowship among members and to look after guests to club meetings. This is also the committee that looks after the thoughtful presents given to our guest speakers.

SERVICE: There is a two-fold approach to service for Zontians - monetary and personal. The international projects are supported almost exclusively by monetary while the local projects are supported personally by giving of an individual's time as well as financially.

MEMBERSHIP AND CLASSIFICATION: This committee is charged with determining the eligibility of each person proposed for membership in the club. As a service organisation for executive women in business and the professions, proper classification of the membership is important. The basic principle of classification is that the business or profession determines the major classification not the individual's position. The three main requisites for membership include the quality of the business or the profession, the position of the prospective member and the desirability of the proposed new member.

PROGRAM: This is the group of hardworkers who plan the themes of the monthly meetings. They look after all the nitty gritty like arranging guest speakers, booking the meeting venues, table seating at the function and supplying program information to the public relations committee.

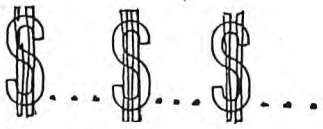
PUBLIC AFFAIRS: This committee plans programs and makes recommendations on action response to issues of public concern. Some areas for activity could include a campaign for equal protection of women under the law or promoting safety in all facets of living.

STATUS OF WOMEN: This committee's duty is to recommend action to support Zonta's objects, specifically Object B: "To improve the legal, political, economic and professional status of women". Zontians have supported this concept as a "raison d'etre" for Zonta Clubs and have been concerned with improvement of women's position in society since 1919, when the first Zonta Clubs were established.

NEWSLETTER: That's us folks! The role of this committee is to keep you up to date with the latest events of interest to members. The onus also is on you to keep us informed of issues, topics or notices you would like to bring to the attention of all members.

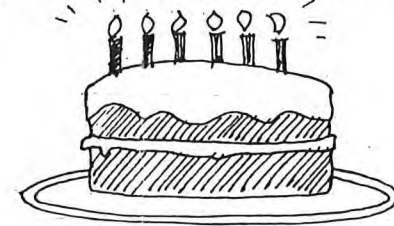
A BIG THANKS TO JEAN SINCLAIR

DID YOU KNOW?

The Confederation of Zonta Clubs was founded on November 8, 1919, in Buffalo, New York. This Confederation united the "original Nine" - nine groups of similar philosophy organised by the first club which had been formed in Buffalo the previous spring.

Its first five businesswomen members, inspired by service organisations like Kiwanis and Rotary for men, felt that with the passing of the Equal Suffrage Amendment to the US Constitution that year and the record for service made by women during World War I, women should participate in a world in which they were rapidly growing in status and responsibility. Mary E. Jenkins, Syracuse newspaper publisher and civic leader, was elected the first president of the Zonta Confederation.

WOMAN OF ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The Zonta Club of Brisbane's Woman of Achievement Award this year has been presented to fashion designer, Keri Craig. Keri has received a range of honours for her designs, most recently in the Retailers Association of Queensland Fashion Design Awards.
