TO DISTRICT XVI BOARD MEMBERS, PRESIDENTS & MEMBERS OF ZONTA CLUBS OF  
DISTRICT XVI

In accordance with article X section 4 of the Bylaws of Zonta International the following resolutions are forwarded for consideration at the District XVI Conference to be held at the International Hotel Rotorua from the 26th September to 29th September 1985.

- 1) That proposed By-law amendments be debated and voted for by clubs at District Conference, empowering the Governor by a two-thirds majority to vote for or against the proposed amendments in accordance with the District authority at a specially constituted Board meeting prior to Convention.

Submitted by the Zonta Club of Auckland.

Rationale: The Zonta Club of Auckland believes that proposed amendments to the International By-laws should be debated at the District Conference to enable a more reasoned District view to be expressed than the fragmented two minute discussions from the Convention floor. In addition, as Zonta grows in the non-English speaking world with consequent difficulties faced by delegates participating in a Convention not in their native tongue, representatives from such Districts would be able to debate By-laws in their own language and enable Governors to have a greater grasp of what the true wishes of their clubs were.

- 2) That the District Treasurer collect International Dues with District Dues and within 30 days of due date remit the same to Zonta International with a certificate as to the clubs of good standing in her District.

Submitted by the Zonta Club of Auckland.

Rationale: As administrative costs of Zonta International escalate and problems of remitting money to the U.S. increase it is suggested this amendment would result in Zonta International having to handle only about twenty District instead of one thousand Club cheques.



The resulting economy plus each District funding its own expenses of collection would mean less dissipation of money collected at a lower level. The need for establishing credentials would be negated as each District would take responsibility to certify clubs in their own District.

- 3) That the 1985 District XVI Conference requests both the International By-law Committee and the International Membership Committee to investigate the establishment of Zenith clubs for Past-classified and senior members of Zonta Clubs and report their findings to the International Convention in Toronto, in 1986.

Submitted by the Zonta Club of Auckland and endorsed by the Zonta Club of Sydney.

Rationale: A number of Zontians in the District are concerned that experienced and able women are being lost to Zonta membership and activities due to the restrictions of Past-classified membership. Some clubs have a rapidly ageing membership whose members find it increasingly difficult to attend evening meetings and/or meet financial obligations but because of strong loyalty and devotion to Zonta ideals wish to continue their support but in a less demanding way.

- 4) That District XVI does not support or wish to participate in any silver plate award system to its Area Directors or Lieutenant Governor as it is contrary to the philosophy of Zonta International and wasteful of funds.

Submitted by the Zonta club of Manawatu.

Rationale: A proposal has been mooted to encourage membership growth amongst clubs. Those clubs bringing in 10 new members or 10 new classifications would receive a discount on the Convention fee for their club delegate and Lt. Governors and Area Directors responsible would receive silver plate awards.

- 5) That when a Zontian resigns from one club and is accepted as a member in another club she not be sent the full introductory and welcoming material from Head Quarters but simply an acknowledgement that she is now a member of that club.

Submitted by the Zonta Club of Manawatu Area.

Rationale: The current practice is that when a member resigns from one club because of transfer and is accepted into membership by another, Head Quarters approval is accompanied by the whole package of material as sent to new members. This is not only considered unnecessarily wasteful of materials but also of Head Quarters postage.

- 6) That International Dues be assessed for the proportion of the average wage of the country of origin to avoid the problem of inflationary currency rates.  
Submitted by the Zonta Club of Marlborough Area.

Rationale: The average wage of many countries is below that of the U.S. and currency conversion rates place an added burden on remittances to the U.S.

- 7) That International Dues be held by and administered by the country of origin.  
Submitted by the Zonta Club of Marlborough Area.

Rationale: Monies held by the District would give the District greater control and responsibility for its finances and enable a greater check to be kept on the good standing of its clubs.

- 8) That International Dues be paid to Zonta International Headquarters in the currency of the country of origin.  
Submitted by the Zonta Club of Tokoroa/Putaruru Area.

Rationale: Excessive fees are a deterrent to new members and in sustaining current members. The high rate of exchange necessitates raising much more money for overseas projects. The aims of "Zonta" are being lost by the financial restrictions placed on our recruitment ability.

- 9) That the compulsory subscription to the Zontian should be waived or a cheaper magazine printed preferably on airmail type paper.  
Submitted by the Zonta Club of Tokoroa/Putaruru Area.

Rationale: The added cost to subscriptions plus high postage rates from the U.S. impose an additional burden on clubs for International Dues.

The following letter , or rather summary thereof is being prepared by Zonta Club of Mana Area (Porirua, New Zealand to present at the District XVI Conference with the proposal that it be forwarded from the Conference to Zontian Clubs in France. Dear Zontians of France: During our District XVI Conference Zontians representing Zonta Clubs of Australia and New Zealand, resolved to write to you about nuclear weapons testing in the Pacific. We write invoking the Zonta objectives to work for the advancement of understanding, goodwill and peace, through a world fellowship of executive women in business and professions, united in the Zonta ideal of service and bearing in mind the Decade of Women's theme "The building of confidence, tolerance, mutual respect and co-operation." With these thoughts in mind we bring you our message of concern about the testing nuclear weapons in the Pacific. We would like you to write and share your feelings with us on this issue.

PLEASE THINK ABOUT THE ABOVE AND ALSO PLEASE STUDY RESOLUTIONS ALREADY CIRCULATED AND BE PREPARED TO GIVE JOCELYN YOUR THOUGHTS ON ALL THESE THINGS TO GUIDE HER IN HER VOTING AS OUR DELEGATE AT CONFERENCE.

NOTES FROM STATUS OF WOMEN: WHO CARES? In recent years, emphasis has been placed on providing care for frail aged and disabled people in the community, rather than in institutions. While the merits of this are widely accepted, little attention is given to the needs of people who actually provide this care. Recent data shows that over 90% voluntary "community" care is provided by women, usually family members, many of whom carry substantial burdens and severe limitation to employment and other options which may otherwise be available to them. Government and non-Government organisations offer little to these unpaid careers, yet frequently accept credit for "community-based" programmes.

More and much more from Leneen at our dinner meeting in November.

## CONFERENCE REPORT from Jocelyn Grant-Taylor

Approximately 240 Zontians attended the 6th Biennial District Conference in Rotorua from September 27 to 30, chaired by Valerie Webster as District Governor with Erlinda Villanueva of the Philippines as the International Representative. She won the esteem of us all by her charm and easy manner, and presented the report on behalf of President Anniki. Three main issues emerged:

- (i) A fee increase is forecast in spite of the economies put into effect since the Sydney Convention
- (ii) The options under consideration for Zonta International Service Project for 1986-1990. There are two choices of varying time spans and varying training programs - all aimed at the education of women, mainly in Africa
- (iii) The possibility of Z.I. purchasing its own property in Chicago.

Of special interest was the report of the first Z Club delivered by their first president, Alison Baxter, who had two part-time jobs to get herself to the conference. That's Quality!

The outstanding effort in Fund Raising was a radio appeal by Auckland II Club for their service project, "Research into Cot Deaths" which raised \$107,000.

Of the 27 Resolutions finally presented, 9 were withdrawn or lapsed for want of a seconder; the remainder being well debated.

Of principal concern - The Lt. Guv. will continue to alternate between Australia and New Zealand.

An International Committee is to be set up to consider Mandatory Dues and Erlinda was directed to convey the concern of District XVI - covered by a number of Resolutions.

Also passed-on amended letter, deploring Nuclear Testing in the Pacific, to be sent to the Zonta Club of France, and a further resolution to be conveyed to ZI "That the Clubs of District XVI urge ZI to adopt a policy to ban nuclear weapons" - and to implement this Auckland Club moved "That resolutions in respect of Zenith Club & Nuclear Policy be published in the "Call to Convention" for Toronto - the cost to be borne by the District. This is essential to ensure that the Resolutions are in the Agenda.

I enjoyed the learning, the hospitality and the Friendship of the Conference. I felt proud to be a Zontian, listening to the caring concern of the delegates and was sad none of you were able to share it with me. Let's all aim to be at Adelaide.
