FROM THE GOVERNOR'S NEWSLETTER...

Members requested more information on "The Institute of Cultural Affairs" as mentioned in the International Service Projects - Choice A Major. Briefly, the work of the I.C.A. is based on a "human development" approach which presumes that the people involved are the origin of the plans, rather than the target. The Institute promotes participation in the development of communities and organisations by providing:

- . Methods of community-wide planning, decision making & project management
- . Approaches to motivation which encourage people to handle their own problems
- . Training programs to develop leadership skills
- . Systems for the exchange of resources, expertise and other forms of co-operation .

The I.C.A. has made a major commitment to women's advancement. They assist women in their self-help efforts and offer training in leadership skills. They also organise events to bring women together from various local, regional and national headquarters. The Institute's headquarters are in Brussels and it was founded in 1952.

SERVICE COMMITTEE SUBMISSIONS.

Red Hill - Paddington Community Housing Group, is a self-help group which aims to provide low-cost accommodation and control over housing to people who have difficulty in exercising choice over their accommodation. This is an innovative group which is attempting to solve individual problems at a local community level. Their request was for \$8,600.00 being cost of repairs to the roof of the Group's house which accommodates four young families in four flats.

Teen Challenge (Brisbane) Incorporated, is an organization which aims "to reach troubled youth in Queensland and to provide counsel and rehabilitation in a Christian concept". They provide an emergency youth shelter at Hebron House. Their request ^{is} was for funding for their rehabilitation farm at Stanthorpe.

Australian Brain Foundation, is requesting funding for its Research Program into head injuries. Their request is for a contribution towards the cost of the salary of a Research Medical Officer and the supply of a computer - an amount of \$40,000.00.

Turner Playground, Stafford,

A donation of \$250.00 was made last year to support the work of the Playground and a recommendation came from the membership to make a similar donation this year. The Playground provides an invaluable service in caring for children after school and during holiday times.

The Autistic Children's Association, provides education, therapy and support for Autistic Children and their families. Because of the nature of Autism, these children are unable to utilise any other facilities in the community and without the Association's Centres and services most if not all of the children would require institutional care. The organization receives subsidies for salaries only, equipment and running expenses must be met from the Associations own resources. The Association is seeking funds for the purchase of equipment ; either an Ausaphone \$250.00 ; or Tripod \$100.00 ; or Video Cassettes \$10.00 each ; or Bus \$30,500.00.

Youth Advocacy Centre

Y.A.C. provides a Legal Service for young people in Brisbane. It is a unique service which seeks to represent the rights of children who come before the Childrens Courts, more often as victims than as offenders. Salaries are subsidised through the Attorney General's Department but again equipment and running costs have to be funded by the Agency itself. The Centre is seeking funds for the purchase or rent of a Commander S.416 phone. Cost : Purchase \$5,000. Rent \$1,761.00 ; plus \$784.00 installation.

Brisbane Womens Health Centre

This organization provides health services such as information and counselling, self-help groups and community education. Their request ^{is} was for \$10,000.00 towards the salary of an Administrator.

Adelaide Billing Ward

An on-going Service Project, which involves the decoration of this Childrens Ward, both throughout the year and at Christmas time. Money has been made available for this in the past but donations in kind ie. gifts, decorations, hand made stuffed toys, and toys for use in the Ward, have been supplied by Club Members.

Australian Association of Stomal Therapy Nurses (Queensland Branch.)

Late submission not considered this year.

Granada

The St. John of God Brothers run a residential care training programme for intellectually, emotionally and socially disadvantaged young adults at Ashgrove. These adults come from homes where their families cannot or will not care for them any longer, and they do not fit into any group that is cared for by other community help organizations. Two programme officers are employed to help them to develop independent living skills so they can cope with living on their own or sharing accommodation with others within twelve months. The Commonwealth Government provides an 80% salary subsidy. Specific requests are for - Washing Machine 20% of approx \$500.00 ; Human Development Slides \$350.00 : Telephone Answering Machine \$300.00 .

Windsor & Districts Senior Citizens Centre

This Centre, due to be opened on 22nd March, will fill a big need in providing Day Care for the elderly, Meals on Wheels, Counselling and Recreational Services for the general well being of the over 50's of the district.

Although they received a substantial Government Grant - costs have escalated and help is needed with the Furnishing. It is proposed to assist by buying a Filing Cabinet for the office section at a cost of Approx. \$200.00.

A permanent acknowledgement of Donors will be made on an Honour Board in the Entrance Foyer. Amongst the Service Clubs so listed are - The Quota Club Brisbane North, Rotary Club Windsor and Lions Club Grange, and it would be fitting for Zonta to be included.

Mutual Assistance for Indochinese.

M.A.I. aims to provide in the Brisbane area a drop in centre for the Indochinese community. Membership is drawn from Vietnamese, Lao, Cambodian, Chinese and Australian communities, however those from the Vietnamese community are the major group. It is run entirely by volunteers (Indo Chinese and Australian) under the leadership of Sister Lurlene English as Co-ordinator and backed by a committee with Australian and Indochinese members, which provides a wide range of professional support and advice and management expertise. M.A.I. is primarily dependent on donations. It requires funding to help improve its school homework support programme, its library and its volunteer service. In addition it needs volunteers for running services and providing expertise on one of their committees.

"The newsletter editor is just that - the person who edits the Club newsletter. If there are no contributions, there is nothing to edit."

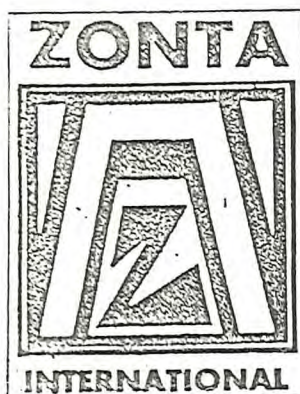

All international service projects are deemed to start with a zero base. When contributions come in after the project is completed, these contributions are retained in the service monies account. When a service project has a specifically committed amount, the excess contributions from previous bienniums will be used to cover any deficiencies in the total amount received for the project. SINCE 1972, however, biennial contributions have always covered the amount needed for the projects, giving rise to the accumulated excess funds.

An exhilarating meeting was held with Senator Susan Ryan on Friday 11 May at Images.

The Minister said it was the largest meeting anywhere in Australia, and the whole area was completely overflowing with eager and anxious women. The National Agenda for Women is an attempt at the reviewing the Decade for Women and raising issues as we move towards the year 2000. The Committee is moving around all States holding meetings, with the intention of hearing what women have to say. Their slogan is "A Fair go for Women".

The Queensland audience certainly did not leave them wanting - there was eager participation with suggestions covering areas such as:

- courses are needed to train women for politics
- higher professional profile in the media
- post school courses for the handicapped
- a migrant women's network needed
- education of women (rather than just girls) was a strong option postulated by Professor Eileen Byrne
- June Morris put a strong case for education of the reproductive cycle.

Women received 24.7% less for the average pay than men and male occupations were listed as:

- Administrative executive and managerial
- farmers
- fishmen
- transport and communications
- tradesman and labourers

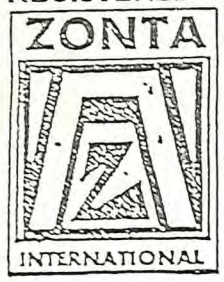
