PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Well 1987 is now well underway and as work gets busier for all of us, Zonta's year begins in earnest. Here are some of the important Zonta happenings you need to be aware of:-

New Venue - March 9 will be our first Dinner Meeting at the Ridge Motor Inn on Leichhardt Street. Although Petrie Mansions was a nice setting for our first meeting, I think the Ridge will provide us with a good longterm venue.

As before, apologies to Rob. Aydon on the Friday before; meeting time is 6.30 for 7 p.m. and our room is on the 1st Floor. Parking is available on the street and in the garage next to the Ridge. There is parking underneath the Ridge but you will need to punch in a code to open the doors. I'll explain it in detail at the next meeting.

Fifth Area 1 Workshop - Joie Dwyer Area Director is holding the Area Workshop on the theme "Every Zontian Involved" on April, 3rd, 4th and 5th at the Ipswich Homestead Hotel.

Area Workshops are an opportunity for new Zontians to learn a great deal about Zonta and for longer standing members a chance to renew their links with Zonta's goals. These weekend workshops are important because they give us the time to think about and discuss Zonta issues. Without that time (which we often can't manage at dinner meetings!) I feel we don't get as much from Zonta as we could - the chance to meet other professional women, the chance to make new friends among our own club, and the chance to make the most of being part of a vital and growing organisation.

I've enclosed a copy of the registration form. The first closing date has passed so send in your registration quickly. I will be going and I'm looking forward to seeing a lot of Brisbane North faces there.

Decisions from the Board - Have you ever wondered what it is the Board does on your behalf? Well I can tell you that all board members take their jobs seriously and act in your interests.

At our first meeting for the year, a lot was discussed and two issues of major importance were raised -

- The need to review membership intakes and make sure all members

know what the protocol should be. There was concern about the numbers dropping out of the club. The Board felt that members should know the proposed new member fairly well. This would ensure the new member had some contact in the club to help them settle in.

The Board will ask the Membership Committee (current and incoming) to assess the range of issues involved and report back to the Club.

- The need to allow time for fellowship at dinner meetings. The Board felt there was sometimes little time for fellowship. Steps to alter the situation have been taken and, although we do have a busy few months coming up, I hope to leave you more time for fellowship at meetings.

Service Projects - At the March Meeting we will be discussing and deciding upon our service project. I know the Service Committee has been working hard and their appraisal is enclosed with the newsletter. Give it some thought and we will be ready to make a considered decision on March 9.

2. SERVICE COMMITTEE

Service Project Submissions, 1987

Major Projects

(i) Penola Nursing Home. A deficit funded Nursing Home of 30 beds conducted by the Sisters of St. Joseph. Penola receives no other community or church support, and relies on fund-raising of the residents themselves to meet basic needs like linen and maintenance etc. Penola is a beautiful place, neat, clean, efficient, attractive and homely, a tribute to the management and staff and residents themselves. Their request is for -

- (a) A grant towards the building of a community lounge
- (b) Bed Pan Sanitizers \$4,000
- (c) Drug Trolley \$1,400.

(ii) Chisholm Shelter. A community based refuge for women and their families at risk of physical violence from their spouses. It can accommodate 5 families at a time, each family sharing one room, with communal bathroom and kitchen facilities. The house is rented. Government subsidy covers salaries of refuge workers and operating costs within a no frills budget. Extra funds are needed for play equipment, linen, household items and emergency relief.

Their request is for -

- (a) A Gazebo in the yard to extend the house, provide security for mothers who wish to be in the yard with their children and an alternative counselling area.

(iii) Blue Nurses Car - Cars used by Blue Nurses in their Home Nursing program are purchased entirely from Fundraising. The contribution made by this service to the health and well-being of aged people is familiar to all. Recently the service has been extended through the Mater Hospital to ante and post natal care of mothers and babies - primary care, preventive medicine and education rolled into one. Their request -

- (a) Replacement Vehicle \$1,900.

(iv) Queensland Marriage Guidance Council is a nation wide, non-profit organisation, providing marital and family counselling and education. Funding is supplied as follows:-

Fed. Govt. 64%; State Govt. 2%; Client contributions 34%. Funding in real terms has decreased; the demand has increased and the organisation is unable to secure finance to provide necessary furniture and equipment in their new premises at Spring Hill.

Their request -

- (a) \$4,000 toward the cost of computer equipment
- (b) \$1,500 for white-boards, shelving and chairs

Smaller Projects

(i) Turner Playground - Stafford - One of several playgrounds conducted by the Playground and Recreation Association of Q'Land, providing vital after-school and holiday care for children. Their request -

- (a) Chest Type Freezer \$400.

(ii) Child Accident Prevention Foundation of Aust. provides child safety capsules for infants up to 6 mths for a small rental. Each capsule's rent covers the cost of its own replacement so it is self-funded. However, demand exceeds supply so more capsules are needed. Their request -

- (a) Safety capsules at \$80 each.

(iii) Parent Air Group - Royal Children's Hospital - This Scheme trains volunteers from the community to supply, befriend, educate, train parents who have abused or are at risk of abusing their children. It is a very positive, non-punitive, effective

cost effective approach to a difficult and growing problem in the community. Their request -

- Options - library equipment \$300
- educational equipment \$250
- Course fees \$50-80

- (iv) Mary Haven Scarborough - a Rest home for women, Mary Haven was established four years ago by two Sisters of St. Joseph's. It provides preventative respite care for up to 10 days for mothers under stress. A grant of \$6,000 provides domestic assistance; all other operating costs come from the community. Their request -

Household items \$785.00 (1 Fripan, 4 Microwave Dishes, 8 Thermal Blankets, 20 Large Bath towels, 1 4-Space Toaster).

- (v) Association for the Development of the Intellectually Handicapped
This organisation was formed 8 years ago to offer practical support and companionship to families of the handicapped. It is a support group for the Structured Intervention Play Programs in Brisbane and the Gold Coast. It receives no Government funding. Their request -

Funds to provide outings (e.g. one outing costs \$50)

- (vi) Windarra Women's Shelter - Windarra operates under similar organisation to Chisholm and accommodates four families. The Shelter has a Management Committee and is sponsored by the East Brisbane Community Centre. Their request -

Household items e.g. Children's pool, portable fans, laundry trolley, baby strollers, locking baby gates, linen, sheets, towels, e.t.c. B.B.Q. plate.

The Service Committee strongly recommends all of these organisations to Club Members. Each one provides an example of (mainly) women working voluntarily and professionally using their skills, talents, time, money and compassion to meet needs in the community. And they do it in competent, caring and inventive ways. Apart from our Club's collective response to these requests, we ask members to wrack their brains, squeeze their bank accounts, con their relatives and pull strings in their networks to meet whatever need strikes the strongest note to each one. We look forward to receiving your contributions, suggestions etc. at the next Dinner Meeting.

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Club Incorporation - You might remember that I brought up the issue late last year and explained that it was in the Club's interest to limit our liability by incorporating. The motion to incorporate was passed but we still have not finalised this.

According to the Justice Department's guidelines, I should have given advance notice to club members that such a motion would be put forward. Anyway, I'll give notice now that a special resolution to incorporation will be put forward at the April dinner meeting (I'll get it right sooner or later!)

Expo '88 - On your behalf I went to a meeting at Expo House with representatives of other Zonta Clubs in South East Queensland. At that meeting Glenda McChesney-Clark and Judy Ellis of Brisbane South told us about the Expo plans. Zonta, as part of the (combined) Service Clubs Expo Committee has the opportunity to sell advance season passes to Expo '88. Along with Rotary, Lions and Quota, Zonta can sell season passes (unlimited admission for the six months of Expo) before tickets are released to the general public.

For each pass sold, the club will earn \$6. The cost of a pass is \$99 and we can sell these from April 1 till 31 July, 1987. For the first month the tickets will not be on general release to the public. This opportunity is one other Zonta Clubs are keen on as a fund-raiser.

You will note that no cooking is involved!!*?!? What a find!

I will have order forms at the April meeting. The procedure is to get the buyer to send in the order form with the money and the club will automatically receive the \$6 rebate. I'm sure many of you are planning to see Expo and have friends/relatives/colleagues who would be interested in advance tickets - ask around.

Zonta will also have access to Service Clubs' Hospitality Centre during Expo and this will provide a welcome spot for a rest and a cuppa. I'll tell you more about this when I see you. I'll also have copies of order forms for you - so get those sales lined up in the meantime.

Our Venue - Parking at the Ridge is in the hotel carpark. Entries are in the side street and behind the hotel. You need to punch a parking code (2000) into the key at the entrance. This will let you in.

We will be in a smaller room this time - our regular spot which overlooks the pool.

After a wonderful start to the year with only three members missing, the February

dinner meeting, we had 14 missing the March meeting. It's hard on the active members because they put their heart and soul into working for the club - attending meetings is one thing we can all do to ensure that we share in and give moral support to those efforts.

Service - Those who were there at the March meeting heard the Service Committee give their report on our local projects and our ongoing commitments.

Behind that presentation was a lot of hard work and strong commitment from Mary Corrie and her committee. I would like to extend grateful thanks to each and every member who served so well on the Service Committee. It was an outstanding effort and is one of which all club members can be proud. Thank you ladies.

Zonta Fair - The necessary forerunner to service funding is of course fund raising. At the March meeting, a proposal was put to the club to change the venue of the Fair to the Ferny Grove Picnic Area. The idea was originally put forward by Ann and Leonie as our Fair Convenors. The idea was then discussed at the Finance and Service Committee Meetings before it came to the dinner meeting.

Both committees liked the idea and believed that the change could bring 'new life' and new people to our Fair. Due to the timing constraints on the Fair and the need to decide on any change quickly. I felt it imperative that the Club as a whole discuss it at the March dinner meeting.

Since our newsletter had already gone to print, there was no way of advising you in writing prior to the meeting.

At the dinner meeting, the issue was brought up for frank and open discussion. It then was put to a club vote. The members present approved the change in a majority vote so we are going full steam ahead for a new Fair at Ferny Grove.

The main reasons for the change are as follows:-

- Numbers in the past few years at Robertson Park had been falling
- Funds raised each year were not increasing. This is a concern as we are not keeping pace with inflation etc.
- The effort to put on the Fair is spread over Club members and members only have a limited number of people they can bring to the Fair.
- Not being on a main road meant that passing trade was limited.
- Ferny Hills has three schools which could be involved in the Fair (bands, displays, etc.) If the children come, so do the (spending) families.
- Entertainment in Ferny Hills area is scarce and a well-publicised Fair would bring a good crowd.
- The Ferny Hills park is on the main road and has a large volume of passing traffic.
- If the Closeburn Markets are still operating, the new venue will be on the way to Closeburn.
- Now that Zonta Club of Brisbane West has been established, perhaps we should leave Brisbane's western suburbs to that club.

The idea is to give it a go and see if we can increase our takings - wouldn't a 50% increase be lovely?

I know some members aren't keen on the change but as with all of our Zonta decisions, the decision is based on a majority commitment. Now we need to concentrate on making the Fair a real success. Ann Gilbert already has some convenors but she does need more. Please ring Ann or Leonie and tell them you're willing to help. I feel strongly that those club members who've been there and done that' will be the best advisers and convenors.

ZONTA RESOLUTIONS

A number of resolutions will be put forward at the District Conference. As a club, we need to decide how we would like to vote on these resolutions. I enclose a brief list of these resolutions in the Newsletter to let you know the broad topics.

Liz Mellish will give you a full briefing on the resolutions at the August dinner meeting and will then ask for your decision on each item. Heather and Carol will then take our decisions to the District Conference.

Resolutions:-

(1) Zenith Clubs

Covers the set up of Zenith Clubs and their purpose. Zenith Clubs are for past classified Zontians. (There may be some discussion of the fee structure proposed for these clubs).

2) Amendment to Bylaws

Covers tightening administrative procedures for circulating amendments to clubs prior to Convention.

(3) Club Payments to Zonta International

Centralising payments of dues to the District Treasurer rather than to Chicago in order to simplify procedures.

(4) Voting Members at Convention

Channelling club votes through International Board members, District Governors for votes on international bylaws to control time lost on voting procedures at International Conventions.

(5) Leave of Absence

Tightening the allowance for leave of absence to three months periods renewable to give up to one year's leave. More control on approved reasons for leave of absence is sought.

(6) Fiscal Year

Amending the club's fiscal year to April 1 to March 31. This is to allow financial accounting to come into line with the club's administrative year.

(7) Insurance

Arrangements to cover Australia and New Zealand for public liability.

(8) Convention Expenses of Governors and Governors Elect.

Resolution to cover travel expenses.

(9) Parliamentarian

Resolution to appoint a parliamentarian to serve during conventions.

(10) Area Boundaries

Change of two NZ area boundaries.

(11) Area 4 Vice Area Director

New position (NZ).

(12) District Project

Resolution to investigate the establishment of a district project in addition to Zonta International projects.

Liz will have all the details on each resolution at the dinner meeting.

There are also some District rules of procedure to be ratified at the conference. Ones of particular interest are - payment of district dues in local currency, clubs must clear dates of inter-club events with area directors before scheduling rules of procedure for District XVI to be revised at the end of each triennium.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE:

Deb has been enjoying a much needed break from her hectic schedule and is looking forward to catching up with Zonta news at the next meeting.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Thank goodness for Carol Fripp who is responsible for the following:

Birthday for Sex Discrimination Act

The Human Rights Commission celebrated the 3rd anniversary of the implementation of The Sex Discrimination Act by inviting members of many organisations to meet with Pamela O'Neil, the Sex Discrimination Commissioner. Also a guest was Pera Wells from the Dept of Foreign Affairs & Trade in Canberra.

The gathering was a lively and controversial one, and the following is a quick summary of some interesting facts:

From August 1, 1984 to March 31, 1987 ... a total of 2210 complaints received -
Commonest complaint (66%) was sex-related (e.g. employer using gender as criterion for appointment/promotion)
Next commonest complaint on marital status, followed by pregnancy.

20-25% of sex discrimination complaints were from males (eg bartenders)

Most types of female complaints from traditional typing positions or from small businesses.

International Role of NGOs (Non-Government Organisations)

Many of the women at the above gathering had been to international conferences within the last 6 months, and it is becoming obvious that more women are gathering together to discuss matters. The international role of NGOs such as Zonta, Soroptomists, BPW etc was succinctly suggested as:

CONFERENCES CAN PASS RESOLUTIONS WHICH IMPACT ON WOMEN
CLUBS CAN THEN TAKE THESE RESOLUTIONS AND LOBBY THEIR OWN GOVERNMENTS (at international level, each country is thereby supporting all other countries)

THIS TECHNIQUE IS PROVING EXTREMELY EFFECTIVE

An example of this effectiveness is the action of BPW from their International Conference where they have been lobbying the government to consider the role of women in the workforce, and how they contribute to the economic state of the nation. A pilot study is presently underway in Sydney and it is anticipated that this study will be widened to include a national perspective. This study may be the beginning of recognising the economic worth of women - both in the home and in the workforce - and could form the basis of many of our future actions. So, the incentive and force for this came

from women meeting at conferences and planning action.
(Are you going to Conference in Adelaide?)
