COMMITTEE NEWS:

New Clinic for women, run by women.

A new clinic has emerged in Brisbane called the Lillian Cooper Medical Centre in Boundary Street, Spring Hill. The two GPs Wendy Parker and Sheila O'Neill are well informed on women's issues and are building a total unit comprising a gynecologist, psychologist, physiotherapist and a nutrition expert (who they say is the busiest team member). They follow traditional practices leaving alternate medicine to other groups. It is worth noting the centre was named after Queensland's first female GP and this ardent feminist fought many battles for recognition at that time (she was also an ardent motorist and one of only two women drivers in Brisbane during 1901). The site of her old home is now that of Mt. Olivett Hospital which was established according to her wishes and that of a life-long friend.

Our thanks go to Carol Fripp for the following comprehensive report on the Gold Coast Mini Workshop:-

AREA MINI WORKSHOP
GOLD COAST - 10 APRIL

For those who could not make the workshop, here is a quick summary of the highlights.

ATTENDANCE ... approx. 60 with representatives from all Clubs except Southern Gold Coast and Rockhampton. It was especially rewarding to have Cairns and Townsville present.

CLIMATE ... horrid! Rain, squalls and more rain. Nevertheless, the workshop never suffered from enthusiasm and creativity.

HIGHLIGHTS..

..Leneen Forde (who is standing for International President at Helsinki) led a brainstorming session on what the future of Zonta should be. This provoked a great discussion on areas such as why we lose valuable members; why workshops were not well attended; why we do not attract younger members; do we need to reorganise? Thoughts given were for a more flexible organisation to cater more for womens' needs; the need to develop more support and encouragement for our own members and their achievements; the need to progress from catering as a fund-raiser, to areas which will not overburden members and will reflect our image as 'professional' women.

..We will have 2 more District Officers from our Area this coming term; Joy Sondergeld (Toowoomba) for Liaison, and Judy Ellis (Brisbane South) as Public Relations - not forgetting, of course, Heather Waldron as Area Director. The Governor commented on the continued high involvement and successes which emerge from our Area - there is no doubt we continue to produce highly motivated leaders.

..Area Directory. This started as a small Status of Women Project mainly for visiting Zontians who attend Exop. It has now moved into being a trial for the District as a networking and information database and we hope will be further developed during the next 6 months. If it works (or should I say when it is perfected) we can then send it to the U.S. to show them a good system that can solve many of their problems.

OTHER AREAS OF NOTE:

Expo Exhibitions are planning a Women's Show at the RNA for 17-20 November, 1988 and are presently canvassing for exhibitors. It is looking as though it could become a very diverse offering with everything from career advice through to high tech information for the women of today. Interested persons can obtain more information from Carolyn Anderson, 252 1422.

WOMEN 88 AWARDS This is a worthwhile Bicentennial Project for which many of our own Zontians should be eligible. So, why not put some names forward - it is an unusual award in that the 10 major recipients will be given the opportunity to personally commission a piece of craft work made for them by the Australian craftswomen recommended by the Craft Council of Australia.

Finally, my thanks go to Jean Sinclair for the following history of the Zonta Club of Brisbane North. Newer members may, in particular, then appreciate more fully the deep respect held for the late Dr Helen Row.

The Zonta Club of Brisbane North was organised by the late Dr. Helen Row, a charter member of Brisbane's first Zonta Club, the Zonta Club of Brisbane. The Brisbane Club was founded in 1971 and it was seven years after this that Brisbane North was formed.

The actual creation of a club depends on an organiser of remarkable enthusiasm and with a talent for picking likely club members. The late Helen Row had extraordinary gifts in this way and Brisbane North is only one of a dozen or so Zonta clubs that have sprung up in recent years throughout the State through the untiring efforts of Helen Row. The word 'untiring' has a special sense here since Helen, a polio victim in childhood, was partially disabled, a fact one was inclined

to forget in her lively presence

Helen Row having encouraged some 34 women from various professions that they should become dedicated Zontians, then arranged an organizational dinner to form the Zonta Club of Brisbane North. This dinner was held on 13th June, 1978 at the United Service Club rooms, Wickham Terrace. The club's first Board was formed at this meeting and Zonta International headquarters in Chicago duly advised. Our actual 'birth' date is 19th June, 1978, since that is the day our club was officially registered at International Headquarters in Chicago.

However, there still was the formal ceremony of chartering that had to be performed by a Zontian from International Headquarters. Brisbane North received its charter in a joint ceremony with the newly-formed Zonta Club of Brisbane South from International President-elect Shirley Schneider at a formal dinner at the Melbourne Hotel, South Brisbane on 11th April, 1979.

As we were promised at the club's beginnings, the rewards of belonging to Zonta are many, especially in friendships formed and the opportunity to meet women from so many walks of life that possibly would not otherwise arise. The tasks of Zonta in its service to the community are challenging, but the rewards are there for those who work for Zonta and return in exactly the same proportion of input an individual member is prepared to make.

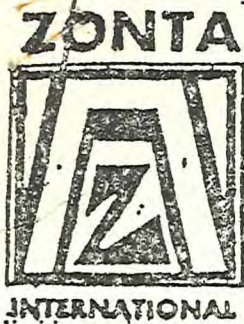
Elizabeth enjoys social tennis every week, wind-surfing when the weather is right for it, and talks alot about giving up chocolate one day.

AMELIA EARHART DAY - 11TH JANUARY

A reminder that the Amelia Earhart function is to be held on 8th January, 1989 from 11.00am at the Bonney Room, Brisbane Airport. Guest speaker will be a women from the field of aviation.

Some timely information contained in everthing you always wanted to know about Zonta -

Amelia Earhart has been a member of the Zonta Clubs of Boston and New York City (her sister, Muriel Earhart Morrissey is still a member of the Zonta Club of Medford, Massachusetts). Amelia was the first woman to make a solo flight across the Atlantic Ocean and set other records such as the non-stop transcontinental course from Los Angeles, California to Newark, New Jersey.

When Amelia disappeared on her around-the-world flight in 1937 (she was 40 years old), the Zonta convention body of 1938 voted to honour her memory by establishing the Amelia Earhart Fellowship Awards.

In 1988-89, 35 fellowships were awarded, each valued at \$6,000 U.S. Since 1938, over 50 years, 511 awards have been made, totalling \$2,198,325. Forty countries have been represented in such diverse fields as Physics, Astronomy, Astro-Physics, Geological Oceanography, Computer Science, Fluid Dynamics and Meteorology.

BUSINESS WOMAN OF THE YEAR:

This year's Bulletin Qantas Business Woman of the Year Award has been won by Virginia Dowd, Founder and Managing Director of the Women's Investment Network (WIN).

Dowd, 40, based in Brisbane, has established a national network of personal investment planners specialising in educating women in how to manage their finances.
