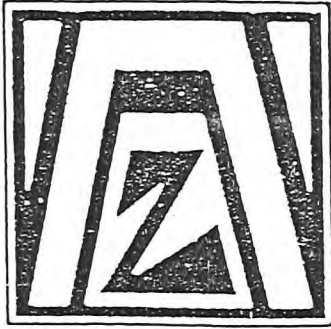

ZONTA INTERNATIONAL was founded in Buffalo, New York in 1919 and became International in 1930. Zonta is a worldwide Classified service organization of executive women in business and professions, working to improve the legal, political, economic and professional status of women. 'Zonta' is derived from the Sioux Indian language and means 'honest and trustworthy' and Zonta's emblem is composed of five Sioux Indian symbols. There are now more than 1000 Clubs in 52 countries. Zonta has consultative status with United Nations agencies and each biennium, Zonta's changing project is determined by a current United Nations involvement eg. its present co-operation with UNIFEM. Zonta has also a continuing project- since 1938 the award of Amelia Earhart Fellowships annually, for women graduates to study aerospace related science and engineering.

Zonta has Z clubs for high school youth and Golden Z clubs for college youth to participate in community projects. ZONTA CLUB OF BRISBANE NORTH was founded in 1978 and is one of many throughout the state- each of which supports the international projects and decides each year what local projects it will support. ZONTA NORTH has been involved with a children's playground, womens hostels, the Blue Nurses, Mt. Olivet, a nursing home and a number of other causes. Fundraising activities have consisted of Fairs, a walkathon, Picnic races and many smaller activities. Sometimes a purely fellowship event is held eg. morning teas.

Our 'hands on' activities include decoration and provision of gifts for a ward of the Children's Hospital, painting and decorating a room for the 'Friends of Brain Injured Children' and help for a children's playground. The Club holds monthly dinner meetings, often with a guest speaker, and it has a number of committees which meet monthly eg. Fellowship, Programme, Status of Women.

Zonta provides individuals with an opportunity to work for worthy causes and to interact with executives outside their own area of expertise. It provides opportunities for leadership at the Club, Area, District and International level and to meet at conferences women from many other countries.

Zonta North members either live or work on the North side of Brisbane or in the city itself.

The May meeting will be my last official duty as President, and I look forward to presenting the Club with the Annual Report.

These are the Programme goals for Leneen's biennium - so please read them

1. Community Service Projects - Each club shall conduct local service projects and implement community programs.

- Promote literacy (UN International Literacy Year 1990).
- Encourage peace initiatives and action on environmental issues.
- Educate against drug abuse and violence.
- Eliminate discrimination against women, the aged, the handicapped, and racial minorities.
- Encourage young women to consider political science; local, national, and international decision-making processes; and careers in the public sector.
- Inform and acquaint members with the culture and customs of another country (UN World Decade for Cultural Development).
- Encourage Z Club/Golden Z Club programs.

2. International Service Projects - Each club and District shall support International projects and implement International networking programs.

- Contribute to the Zonta International Amelia Earhart Fellowship Awards (\$6,000 for graduate students in aerospace-related fields).
- Contribute to the United Nations Development Fund for Women (UNIFEM).
- Encourage contributions from friends of Zonta to the Zonta Foundation Endowment Fund.
- Support the purposes and activities of United Nations agencies (particularly UNIFEM, UNESCO, UNICEF, ILO, and INSTRAW).
- Cooperate with other clubs and Districts to foster International Relations, peace, and goodwill by whatever means of networking deemed appropriate (professional exchanges, support of inter-club projects, study tours, etc.)

3. Public Relations, Membership, and Organization and Extension - Each club and District shall support recruitment and retention efforts and increase visibility.

- ① Build prestigious image and focus on public relations efforts.
- ① Create visibility in the business community and encourage networking.
- ① Increase membership by 10% and develop effective recruitment and retention programs.
- ① Cooperate with the world-wide team of organizers and mentors (to be known as the Century Club).
- ① Organize a new club or give financial aid to Organization and Extension efforts of the Century Club.
- ① Strive for diversity and quality of membership.
- ① Invite to membership at least one member of distinction in a key government decision-making position and at least two in the younger age bracket.

4. World Headquarters Building - Clubs are encouraged to continue their financial support of the Building Fund until the outstanding debt is cleared.

It is recognized that since individual clubs vary by custom, culture, and financial resources, they may not be able to implement all the goals proposed above. Nevertheless, each club should endeavor to achieve as many goals as possible...considering their circumstances.

The 1990-92 Program Goals will be presented for adoption at the 1990 Convention in Dallas.

THE CENTURY CLUB

ADVANCEMENT GRANT

The draft proposal for the advancement grant is included for your consideration. The Club voted to make a grant this year, so \$500.00 will come out of the capital funds raised so far.

SERVICE COMMITTEE REPORT

The Service Committee recommendation is that the money be shared between four organisations.

These organisations are:-

Youth Advocacy Centre is a legal and welfare agency for young people under the age of seventeen years. The centre assists many young people with legal, family, school and accommodation problems. It receives some Government funding, but the organisation is run on a shoe string. The Centre requested a Facsimilie Machine to enable other organisations to FAX documents for urgent consideration.

Richmond Fellowship of Queensland provides supported accommodation, welfare and rehabilitation to the psychiatrically disabled. Supported accommodation is offered at Clayfield and Zillmere and training programs are offered to residents. Many of the Street Kids in our city today have psychiatric problems and are helped by Richmond Fellowship. Their request was for a Microwave Oven.

Pain Clinic at the Royal Brisbane Hospital is a co-ordinating service to provide the most appropriate method of pain relief for individual patients. The Pain Clinic has requested a machine commonly called a Syringe Driver. This machine administers narcotic analgesics by continuous infusion to patients with disseminated cancer. The drug is administered subcutaneously obviating the need for intravenous drips, and most importantly, it permits many patients to be cared for at home. At present, the Pain Clinic at the Royal Brisbane Hospital has **NO** Syringe Driver.

Turner Playground at Stafford is well known to many of our members as the Club has supported the Playground for the past few years. Turner, a branch of the Playground and Recreation Association of Queensland offers safe supervised and free facilities for all school aged children, both after school and during school holidays. Situated in Brisbane North, it caters for children from 35 State and Church schools, and during school holidays, provides care for over 200 children each day. Most of these children are from underprivileged families. Last year, our Club members furnished and decorated a Sick Room. The playground has now requested Vinyl Floor Covering for the Sick Room.

The recommendation of the Service Committee is to disburse funds as follows:

\$ 3000 - Zonta International, for International Service Projects

This would leave approx \$8000 for local charities.

As the Club has already agreed to allocate 50% of funds raised to Club Bursary,

- \$4000 - Club Bursary and

\$4000 - to other charities, as follows:

YOUTH ADVOCACY CENTRE - \$2000 - for the purchase of a Facsimilie Machine
 PAIN CLINIC at - \$1150 - for the purchase of a Syringe Driver
 Royal Brisbane Hospital

RICHMOND FELLOWSHIP - \$ 400 - for the purchase of a Microwave Oven

TURNER PLAYGROUND - \$ 210 - for the purchase of vinyl flooring
 for the Sick Room

\$ 3760.00

YOUNG WOMEN IN PUBLIC AFFAIRS AWARDS We have received guidelines from Zonta International for the establishment of these awards at club and district level, providing another opportunity to raise public awareness of Zonta and its aims.

The Young Women in Public Affairs Awards were established to encourage secondary-school women, under the age 19, to enter careers or seek leadership positions in social policy-making, government and volunteer organizations.

The Awards Program will operate at the club, District and International levels of Zonta. Clubs will publicize the Awards at a local level and furnish a prize to a winner who will then compete in the District level competition. The Zonta International Foundation will provide \$500 for each District Award Winner.

The Zonta International Status of Women Committee will select an International Winner from among the 26 District Winners. The International Winner will receive \$1,000 from the Zonta International Foundation. Money for the District and International Awards comes from interest generated by the Zonta International Foundation Endowment Fund.

The Young Women in Public Affairs Awards Program is designed to encourage all women to participate in decision-making in their communities. Additionally, the Awards Program provides a public relations opportunity at the club, District and International levels to project Zonta as an organization committed to promoting the status of women. As local communities follow the Award Winners to the District and International levels, they will learn about the internationality of Zonta and the global efforts of the organization to improve the status of women.

CONCERT What a superb evening's entertainment we enjoyed at Mayne Hall, notwithstanding the traffic complications and the RAAF accompaniment, on Saturday 27th October. Dorothy Stringer is to be congratulated for arranging such a variety of sonderfully talented performers. It was indeed 'Fun with Music', relaxed and enjoyable, and with the added bonus of raising considerable funds for two worthwhile causes.
