INEQUALITY IN BUSINESS TRAVEL

I not only found the following article interesting reading, I found it to be a reasonably true account of airline's attitudes to female business travellers. Perhaps, this is an issue our Status of Women Committee could take up with airline management.

Second rate in business class



YOU are on the 7.40am flight from Sydney to Melbourne on business. You are stuck between two men in grey suits with oversized briefcases, because, as usual, you weren't able to secure a prized aisle seat despite having got up at the crack of dawn in the vain hope of scoring one.

As the plane taxis for take-off, the flight attendant wheels around the reading material. But instead of being offered *The Australian Financial Review*, *BRW* - even *The Bulletin* - you are given the choice of *New Idea* or *Women's Day*.

You are just about to bark sarcastically that *Knitting 101* was unfortunately omitted from the curriculum the year you attended Harvard Business School, but you bite your tongue. After all, sometimes you do feel like reading *New Idea* for a bit of a laugh - you just don't want airlines to always assume it's your only source of information. Also, you don't want to rock the boat (plane?) for fear it will only heighten the chances of your missing out on that second cup of coffee that is so lavishly offered to the men in suits.

Sound familiar?

Such is the plight of the modern woman business traveller. In their grab for the almighty corporate dollar, airlines can occasionally forget that the business traveller can come in two genders. Businesswomen complain that if they are travelling with a male colleague, they can find themselves treated as his secretary or wife. If women travel alone, they are virtually ignored.

Wendy McCarthy, a former senior executive of the ABC, the Australian Bicentennial Authority, the National Trust and now chief executive of law firm Price Brent, says being a female business traveller means, for example, never getting your coat hung up - a service that is invariably offered to the businessman sitting next to you.

"You are left with your coat sitting on your lap," says McCarthy. "Then you have to decide whether you want to complain about it. You don't always want the stress of feeling you have to react for the sake of all women coming after you."

A few years ago, though, McCarthy did complain about the unequal treatment of female travellers - to then Australian Airlines' chief John Sharp. Sharp responded by asking McCarthy to help the airline make a training video for staff. She did. She believes the airlines have since lifted their game a bit on the issue.

Certainly, the airlines these days plead "not guilty" to discriminatory treatment of women. An Ansett spokesman said she was not even aware of any complaints being made by women. Qantas, recently merged with Australian, on the other hand, acknowledged that what it called "the Women's Day syndrome" still existed - on other airlines.

"In our focus groups, women have complained that our competitors still tend to focus on the businessman rather than the business trav-

eller," said Garry Saunders, Qantas product development manager. He said Qantas staff had been trained to give equal, unbiased treatment to all women travellers.

After all, there is a business, not just a moral, imperative behind all this. Saunders says women business travellers were now Qantas' fastest growing segment. In 1992-93, women accounted for 22 per cent of all business trips in Australia, according to the Bureau of Tourism Research.

The worldwide figure is 25 per cent and growing fast: the *International Business Traveller* magazine said predictions are that women could represent 50 per cent of all business travellers by 2000.

Michael Rudny, managing director of Sydney Business Travel, which had seen its female frequent flyer clientele grow by 50 per cent in the

past few years, says recognition of the growing strength of the female executive travel market was now also beginning to trickle down to the hotels. Rudny says hotels, at least the best ones, were looking at ways to better cater to single women travellers.

A lot of women however still need some convincing of that. Women still complain that turning up alone at an hotel is an invitation for slow and patronising service - right down to the worst table in the restaurant.

Some women executives *Corporate Woman* spoke to felt hotels were becoming more accustomed to the single female corporate traveller - dining alone did not automatically mean being shown to the table nearest the toilet. But most still avoided that part of the hotel that posed the most problems for the woman alone - the hotel bar.

For Wendy McCarthy, the hassle of the restaurant/bar on a business trip was not worth the grief - she always opts for room service.

Perhaps it's time hotels looked beyond providing a little extra shampoo as a gesture to their female clientele - and think about ways of really making a woman's stay more comfortable. Female executives would certainly pay for that kind of service.

WIDOWS PEAK

Synopsis: Near a village in 1920's Ireland, a hill has become known as Widows Peak, dominated by a matriarchy of widows. Ruling over all is Mrs. Doyle Counihar (Joan Plowright). Her son Godfrey, (Adrian Dunbar) is the only man allowed there. Among the widows, Miss O'Hara, (Mia Farrow) has a mysterious past and she is stepping out with village dentist Clancy, (Jim Broadbent). Then, a glamorous widow, Edwina Broome (Natasha Richardson) arrives and Widows Peak is disrupted by intrigue and murder.

Comment: First written ten years ago as a vehicle for Maureen O'Sullivan and her daughter Mia Farrow, Farrow now ironically has played the role intended for her mother and she is splendid, with her mix of vulnerability and determination. Joan Plowright has perfected an Irish brogue and she truly dominates WIDOWS PEAK, sailing above all and sundry, often leaving chaos in her wake. With glamorous allure, Natasha Richardson dazzles the locals with her style and beauty - and, as the plot develops, she has an air of mystery. The men are subservient to the ruling women and Adrian Dunbar and Jim Broadbent fill their roles nicely. From the opening shot behind the main title, WIDOWS PEAK shows off a lush green Ireland that we haven't seen since the days of THE QUIET MAN. Now we have a story in which intrigue, comedy and murder are more important than any romance. There are mysteries to be unravelled also and a neat plot twist.

The dialogue sparkles with witty humour and Joan Plowright has some delicious 'put-downs' on people. This is a far cry from recent movies set in Ireland and 'the troubles' are not much mentioned, apart from disparaging comments on the English. Admittedly, this is the 1920's, when life in Ireland was more innocent.

There's a rich music score in Dolby Stereo and the Panavision screen often fills with picture-postcard beauty in the period settings and costumes.

With its original story, top-line cast and elegant production, WIDOWS PEAK has a strong scent of success about it. (Pat Conlan)
