President's Message

Women of the new Millenium, in this evaluative time, it is good to remember that it was this century when women won the right to vote, the right to work (for wages), the right to complain about discrimination and the right to demand social and political justice (as indeed do all Human beings).

It is now generally recognised in even the most developed countries that women are also the primary carers in any family. They provide the primary care for children, by and large, whether these children are one's own or belong to other families, such as provided by childcare facilities, family day care and the like. They are also the teachers of those with disabilities, by and large, or their therapists. They are the teachers of independence when the children grow.

Women also have periods of dependency, when a girl child, or when illness or injuries or stress 'lays us low'. The elderly, predominantly female as well, have always received some care, traditionally within the family, although increasingly in 'institutional' care, but many don't get care that shows respect for their dignity and encourages continued activity of body and mind.

Our social discourse is shaped by a society where there is acceptance that this is 'what women do', sometimes without recognition, generally without assistance (either human or financial) and certainly without input to political systems that may change these conditions.

Our political discourse is shaped by a society based on equality, mutual advantage, a fair go (or Locke's 'free, equal and independent'), so we are told. Many women are not free when they have children, or elderly relatives or become frail themselves. They are not treated as equals in our system, often battling 'the system' to get anything of benefit at all. They are no longer independent. This would not happen to men who have children, or elderly relatives or become frail. One would ask why. One would ask what better could we as women, do to help those who need our 'voice', our expertise, our funds to establish their freedom and independence.

Sure, it is lovely to have fun and enjoy ourselves while helping others, but our social needs cannot rate above the needs of those other women, can they?

This coming year we have identified some groups which need our 'voice', our funding, our practical help and our sympathy. I know you'll be ready to meet all or some of those needs. We'll also try and make sure you have fun while meeting those. It will be a great start to the new Millenium!

President's Message

March is one of those months where the city 'gears up' for the year.

We are too tired, too hot, too... to even consider what the year might bring for us before this, don't you think?



We have just had our New Members' Night. A good cross-section of young women and experienced professionals. My speech to welcome them mentioned the fact that we have a lot in common. Obviously we are all women. I think we all want to give something back to the community, especially the community of women. The women who started this organisation felt the same way in 1919. We share friendships and fellowship through our local and (for some) global network. We work to further women's rights and progress their status. It is even a more difficult task than when Zonta International started. There are many women, here in Brisbane, whose legal rights are swept aside at times, whose political voice cannot be heard at times, whose economic circumstances are below the national poverty line, whose education is cut short through a variety of circumstances which would not stop men in similar situations, whose health needs are not documented or attended to.

The way we address this at the local level is to work hard in our Committees to bring awareness of these circumstances before the women in this city, to educate ourselves on the best method to rectify the situation and to commit to eliminate these inequities. The Committees are the life-blood of our organisation, at the Club level, and at the District level.

We have a Combined Area workshop coming up in April. A prime time to get our network busy on particular issues, don't you think? We can think globally and be 'turned on' by all those projects to vaccinate in Nepal, educate in India, etc., but how about working here, in Brisbane, in Queensland, in Australia, to eliminate the poverty of separated women, the health of aboriginal women, the housing needs of older women, the...

- 3. Status of Women Service. We will merge the two committees and develop a common understanding of what 'advancing the status of women' means and what 'advocacy' for that advancement will entail.
- 4. United Nations. We will create an awareness of U. N. goals and achievements in advancing the status of women and humanity in order to influence and implement these goals. We will create alliances and links, providing information, empowerment through the means of food control and food production.
- 5. Fundraising. We will have a fund raising model like that used in the not-for-profit sector, survey our own members, explore tax deductibility as a means of attracting funds. We will have an annual goal of raising 25% over current funds and a data-base for potential sources of income outside our Club. We will also raise money by holding events and fostering fellowship.

Points to Ponder

Often considered the last area of fund-raising practice, planned giving offers valuable benefits to nonprofit organisations and its dedicated supporters and volunteers. A well-defined giving program will give a reminder to senior donors when they are planning their estate. There are means by which one can provide for a favourite nonprofit organisation in one's will. This could be a specific dollar amount, a selected asset, or specific property.

There are also 'plans' which allow one to pledge a certain amount each week/month or year to one's favourite nonprofit organisations. This is now a part of most church donations.

Have you thought about this?

If Benjamin Britten was right (see quote under), could we say that service to the community does not excite until one is involved in it?

There are several women's organisations who have asked for 'hands on' help – publishing a 'help' card with contact numbers for women in need of help and one who needs women to serve on a management committee until it is able to build up membership and hold an AGM. Contact Thea if you have the

President's Message

I'm not sure if the spirit of change, of renewal can be infectious or whether it is just the run-up to Easter, with all its new start connotations, or maybe it is just the end of a long and weary summer, but it is about this time of the year that most organisations have earmarked for a quarterly review. What with the Ryan by-election some reviews of government policies were on offer as well this year. Not to be outdone or outrun by such events means we also need to catch the spirit of change, the urge to renew, to look at ourselves.

There are those amongst us who feel that changes 'hit' them all the time. This may not be quite right, but perhaps they did not notice the signs of the times, the signals that things peeded to change. Signals like feelings of loss, grief, tiredness, of stress or 'isolation', even non-acceptance. Signs that other 'like' organisations were doing better or more of the great things. Comparisons that leave one feeling a bit dissatisfied. Just more things to add to this long, wearying summer. So, what will be the best method for investing our energies?

Reconciliation and all that On reading Chapter 12 of "the Spirit of the Great South Land", in "An Authentic Life" by Caroline Jones reminded me of my expectations when, as a child of eight I first visited Australia. Living in Singapore I was used to the Festivals, the Celebrations and lifestyles of many cultures, all of which contributed to the richness of everyday life. My maternal grandmother, a Shetlander, had migrated to Melbourne and wrote me a letter in which she told me the same stories Aborigines told their children. I did see some people throwing and selling boomerangs at La Perouse, in Sydney - not Aborigines, though. Now the ABC has run a series telling dreamtime stories - and there were the Olympics! Report of the District 24 Board Held on February 17-18, 2001 Old Government House, Brisbane

Feedback from Clubs, via the Area Directors, identified that clubs want clarification on the role of the District 24 Board, what we have achieved so far, and our "work in progress". We're delighted to share this information with our fellow District 24 Zontians, and we welcome feedback like this in the future.

Who is on the District Board?

What is the role of the District Board?

(Reference: District Board Manual 1999 Edition page 10)

The Zonta International Bylaws specify that the district board has general supervision over clubs and administration of the district. It makes decisions upon matters requiring action between meetings of the district conference, but may not act in conflict with Zonta International Bylaws, the district's rules of procedure, or actions taken by the conference.

More specifically, the District Board

- Should meet at least twice yearly, including a meeting immediately before each district
 conference (some district boards also meet immediately after the district conference. If so, the
 governor may wish to invite members of the district board for the next biennium to the board
 meeting immediately following the conference at which elections were conducted)
- Declares any board office vacant and fills the vacancy by following the procedures specified in the Zonta International Bylaws
- Deliberates on grievances, removal of a district officer and suspension or expulsion of a member or club, according to the procedure in the Zonta International Bylaws

Acts on routine questions to carry out established policies, but does not determine policy, authorize projects or donations, or adopt a budget

Establishes the boundaries for areas within the district provided that a majority of all clubs in the affected areas agree

Proposes goals and long range plans for the district

Works with the governor and the district conference committee or host club to plan the conference program (see section 4 of this manual re: district conferences)

Submits the district conference schedule, including dates and location, to the Zonta International president for approval at least one year in advance

Designates the bank(s) to hold district funds and ensures that the funds are in insurance protected securities

Reviews expenditure in accordance with the approved district budget at each district board

meeting Ensures that the financial records are audited or reviewed by certified or chartered public accountants or by a qualified individual independent of the district board. The books must be closed on May 31 each year for audit or review

Recommends the biennial district budget for approval by the voting members of the district conference

(from the Zonta International Bylaws, current edition. Article V111 Section (b) page 26)

District Board Duties. "The District Board shall have general supervision over clubs and administration of the district. It shall make decisions upon those matters requiring action between meetings of the district conference, provided that none of its acts shall conflict with action taken at the conference. It shall perform duties as prescribed by the bylaws. The Zonta District Manual shall serve as a guideline for district operation."

What has the District 24 Board Achieved To Date? What is "in progress"?

- Operational: development of Corporate Governance strategies*, charities submissions about the definition of charities and related organisations, website development and registration of a new website name www.ZontaDistrict24.org The website now contains the Manual of Procedures, the District Manual, District Committee brochures and District Governor newsletters which can be downloaded or saved to file.
 - * Policies Adopted 17th February 2001 : Anti Discrimination, Freedom of Information, Role Statements for District Board Members & District Committee Chairmen, Leadership Support, Performance Evaluation, Incorporation & Fair Trading, Fundraising, Policy Review, Club Succession Planning
- Consultation / Communication: formation of "Consultant Team" and feedback papers on a range of issues, formation of "Young Zontians Advisory Project" YZAP, planning for Area Workshops, sourcing and costings and format for advertising and promotional videos
- Membership: developing new systems for District nominations (to be sent to your club in March 2001), development and maintenance of a speakers list for use by clubs, assisting those developing new clubs to Charter
- Action / Advocacy: attendance at UN / Beijing +5 seminars, writing media releases, updating Government websites with District information (ie: OSW)
- District Conference: planning workshop topics which offer real value such as a computer lab where members will learn to log on to the internet and visit the district website; an invitation for our Zonta International Respresentative International Treasurer BJ Bourdon to answer our queries about paying international dues and dealing with a fluctuating exchange rate

 Finance: sorting and consolidating financial records to streamline reporting and maintenance, sourcing District Insurance for each member



Incidence Levels

Research by the Australian Bureau of Statistics shows that, at least 1.1 million Australian women have experienced violence by a former partner¹. The same research found that 2.6% of Australian women in married or de facto relationships had been abused by their current partner within the last 12 months.

Extrapolation of this figure to the population of women in marriage or de facto relationships in Queensland suggests that 19,843 Queensland women are likely to be subjected to domestic violence by their current partner.

In Indigenous communities, it is estimated that 90% of families will be affected by domestic violence. Injuries sustained in this violence are likely to be more serious than those of non-Indigenous victims³.

The actual incidence of domestic violence in Queensland is not known as no incidence studies at the state level have been done. However, data used to indicate the level of domestic violence include: the number of applications for domestic violence protection orders; breaches of those protection orders; the rate of police contact with domestic violence incidents; spousal homicide rates; and domestic violence injury statistics collected in hospital Antenatal. Gynaecology and Emergency wards.

Domestic Violence Protection Orders

In the eleven years since the inception of the *Domestic Violence* (Family

Protection) Act 1989 until 30 November 1999. Queensland courts recorded 105,567 applications for protection orders4. In this same period 72,894 protection orders were made. The vast majority of applications not resulting in a protection order were either withdrawn or dismissed/struck out (ie because of insufficient evidence to support the application, the parties have failed to appear or they have requested that the matter be finalised in this manner).

On average, 82% of spouses applying for protection orders are women, while 11% of these applications were made by or for people with an Indigenous background.

Breaches

From 1 July 1998 – 30 June 1999, a total of 3,062 convictions were recorded in higher and lower Courts in Queensland for breaches of an order under the Domestic Violence (Family Protection) Act 1989⁵.

Of the 1,936 appearances in all *lower* courts in Queensland during 1 July 1998 to 30 June 1999, where a breach of a Domestic Violence Protection Order was the most serious offence, the following consequences were recorded:

- 1,145 fines;
- 223 concurrent prison sentences;
- 10 cumulative prison sentences;
- 267 good behaviour bonds; probation, community service, or counselling orders.

In 54 cases no conviction was recorded.

Police Attendance

Statewide figures for police attendance following reports of domestic violence are not currently available. However, in the 12 month period from 1 July 1998 – 30 June 1999, police in the Brisbane Metropolitan (North and South) area, investigated 6,726 domestic violence incidents⁶.

Domestic Violence Homicides

Disclaimer: These figures are not official Queensland Police Service statistics. They have been collated by Senior Sergeant Dale Murray, State Domestic Violence Coordinator for Crime Prevention, Queensland Police Service, in March 2000.

105 'spousal' homicides have been recorded by the Queensland Police Service in the 6 years from January 1994 to December 1999.

These deaths occurred in 85 separate incidents. In 12 of these 85 incidents the offender committed suicide following the killings.

Victims

Of the total deaths of spouses, there were 65 women and 20 men. Victims also included both parents of a spouse, and six children of two families.

Twenty-nine deaths (27.6% of total) were of people from Indigenous backgrounds. Of these, 21 were women, five were men and three were children.

Offenders

In 43 of the 85 total spousal homicides in this period the offender was a non-Indigenous male, in 22 cases he was an Indigenous male. Non-Indigenous female offenders numbered 12 and eight Indigenous female offenders were registered. All the offenders who subsequently committed suicide were men.

Circumstances

Of those killed, 76.5% of people did not have a current Domestic Violence Protection Order against the offender.

Firearms were used in 24.7% of the incidents, knives in 37.6%, and manual methods of killing were used in 29.4% incidents.

Twenty-seven (31.8% of the total incidents) were reported by police as being alcohol related incidents.

Medical Screening

In 12-week trials of domestic violence screening of patients presenting to Emergency, Antenatal, and Gynaecology departments of 5 hospitals in Queensland, 7% of women disclosed domestic violence perpetrated by their current partner⁷.



- 1. Meeting opened at 7.10 PM.
- 2. Welcome. President Thea Biesheuvel welcomed members and special guests from ZIG ZAG, Caitlin Marshall, Julie Chalmers and Christine Maguire.
- 3. Apologies. M. Ferrier, E. Gill, G. Gobe, V. Hallman, A. Hardy, M. Lee, L. Liddle, H. Mohay, K. Thomson, L. Webber.
- 4. Minutes of previous meeting held on 14th May, 2001 were confirmed on the motion of B. Young, seconded M. Mahoney, carried.
- 5. Business arising. Members were reminded about the Alumni Seminar to be held at Women's College on Saturday 30th June and urged to register to support this event initiated by Brisbane North in 2000.
- 6. Correspondence Inward. The Correspondence Folder was circulated and members requested to take any documents relating to their Committees or Task Groups.
- 7. Correspondence Outward. Members were requested to note outward correspondence being circulated in the Correspondence Folder.
- 8. Committee and Task Group Reports.
 - 8.1 PR/Communication. Regular meetings have been established and enthusiasm is growing to achieve good outcomes. Joan Sheridan reminded members about the Fair Meeting next Saturday.
- 8.2. Environment/Advocacy. Vicki Lomax reported that the work of the task group was ongoing and noted the environmental reminders distributed to members. Jean Sinclair attended the Advocacy Workshop which had been reported on in the Newsletter. Vicki also reported that a Theatre Evening is being planned and sought support from members.

Gina Brosnan was coordinating the Awards Group and Barbara Young was coordinating the Service group. Elizabeth Gill had undertaken to keep the club up to date on Amelia Earhart matters. Gina Brosnan then spoke enthusiastically about the Seminar and Dinner for the Alumni on 30th June providing details of the event and speakers.
 - 8.5. Membership. Chris Christensen assisted the President with the Induction of three new members, Helen Gregory, Sharon Herbert and Nicole Nolan. Each was introduced by a member and each spoke briefly about themselves. At the completion of the ceremony they each received the traditional Zonta rose.

GUEST SPEAKERS. Three speakers from ZIG ZAG which is the organisation being supported by Zonta North during 2001 for a project with young women who self harm. The first speaker gave a brief description of the organisation as community based, receiving basic funding from the Old Dept of Health and the Department of Families, working with young women between the ages of 12 and 25 in the Brisbane region. Established 13 years ago, it offers sexual assault services including counselling, groups, community education and training, housing and counselling for young women at risk of homelessness. It also provides a library and acts as a resource centre for young women. Housing is a major concern for many young women and ZIG ZAG provides medium and long term accommodation and support. The speaker noted that young women who are homeless are often invisible as they try not to "sleep rough" in public places like men but seek short stays with friends, relatives or enter into relationships some of There is an acute shortage of emergency shelter for homeless which are far from satisfactory. The sexual assault team works with young women who have suffered women in Brisbane. sexual violence providing support and counselling to young women and their families. The team also engages in community education activities to increase awareness of sexual violence and to improve community attitudes and support for young women who survive violence. The speaker noted that 79% of sexual assault victims are women and over half of these are younger than 25 years with the 15 to 19 age bracket the most likely to be assaulted followed by the 10 to 14 age group and then by the 20 to 24 age group. The third speaker talked about the project with self harming young women which is being supported by the club. She desc ribed "self harm" as any form of violence against one's own body. This can include eating disorders, substance abuse, self injury from cutting, burning, scratching or swallowing harmful things. Self harm is not the same as suicide but a coping mechanism which many young women use to deal with emotional disturbances, conflict with others, emotional and sexual abuse. Young women who self harm do not do it as an attention seeking act but most often go to great lengths to hide it. The problem of self harm spans all social boundaries in the same way as sexual violence and incest. The

project with the young women will run for four months and will include supportive group work during which there will be a sharing of experiences in a safe environment. There will be an adventure based phase which will help foster trusting relationships and self confidence as well as working on good communication and a sense of personal boundaries. The third phase will cover planning the future of the group and individuals within it with a focus on building and maintaining supportive networks as well as developing strategies for using the group's experience to build better understanding within the broader community with regard to young women who self harm. A video will be produced that will document the young women's journey and their understandings and this will be used as a training tool for future groups and service providers.

- Meeting opened at 7.05 P.M.
- Welcome. President Thea Biesheuvel welcomed members and especially guests, Elaine Wainwright, Penny French and Christine Roberts.
- Apologies. A. Frederick, M. Lee, G. Marshall, H. Mohay, J. Prentice, E. Varley, L. Mellish, P. Rego.
- Minutes of previous meeting held on 18th June 2001 were confirmed on the motion of B. Young, seconded E. Fraser, carried.
- 5. **Business arising**. The President noted that ZIG ZAG had supplied a list of needed items for their independent living program. Members will receive a copy for their own reference.
- 6. Correspondence Inward. The correspondence folder was circulated and members requested to take charge of documents relating to their task groups or committees. The President noted the receipt of the Tamworth Conference details and urged members to consider registering and attending.
- 7. Correspondence Outward. Members were requested to note outward correspondence circulated in the correspondence folder.
- 8. Treasurer's Report. The Treasurer reported that the Bank Reconciliation at 30th June 2001 was \$3,373.98 and the Cash Book Balance at 7th July was \$1621.83. She reported that the Alumni event seminar and dinner at Women's College was expected to make a small profit. She moved that her report be accepted, seconded C. Christensen, carried.

9. Reports.

- 9.1 The President advised the meeting that rather than provide a current report on club matters she had been inspired by the speakers at the Alumni Seminar to do talk on the same theme "Making my Way". She spoke of her life as a child migrant to Australia and the course that her life had taken arriving at the present time as President of ZONTA Club of Brisbane North. She ended by noting what she believed were several myths that had arisen about her leadership of the club and disputing the validity of claims made about her actions. She invited comments and discussion during discussion on the restructuring of committees.
- P.R. &C. Joan Sheridan reminded members that the ZONTA Fair was looming and all was going well in preparation. Many donations had been received and others promised. Monday 10th September 2001. At United Service Club, Spring Hill.

- Meeting opened at 7.05 by Vice President Gina Brosnan.
- Welcome: A special welcome for Christine Roberts and birthday greetings to Mercia Ferrier and Heather Mohay.
- 3. Apologies: T. Biesheuvel, P. Burke, N. Foggon, R. Fraser, E. Gill, G. Gobe, H. Gregory, A. Hardy, A. Jones, B. Novello, A.M. O'Connell, J. Schmidt, J. Sinclair, L. Webber, J. Prentice, L. Mellish.
- 4. Minutes of previous meeting held on 13th August, 2001 were confirmed with two amendments, the first related to the U.N. Report legislative awareness classes are not currently available and the second related to the motion moved by C. Christensen regarding committee structure the entire motion to be appended to the minutes. Moved B. Young, seconded B. Newton, carried.
- 5. **Business Arising:** The Chair of the Service Group advised that the two recommendations brought to the last dinner should not be lost her group would look at ways of taking them forward for the club to consider further.
- Correspondence inward: The correspondence folder was circulated and members requested to take particular note of matters relevant to their committees. Of particular note was a letter from Melanie Roberts a young woman from the YMPA program requesting help with connections in Canada where she intends studying. Also noted was the restriction on movement in the CBD during CHOGM.
- 7. **Correspondence outward.** An email requesting members to nominate as representatives at Tamworth brought no responses and the Board therefore nominates Thea Biesheuvel and Chris Christensen who will be attending agreed.
- 8. Treasurer's Report. The Treasurer reported that the Bank Reconciliation at the 31/8/01 was \$17,114.09. She noted that some money in the account had to be transferred to Brisbane West because they had used our credit card facility at a recent function. The cash book balance stood at \$6,784.68. The latest figure for the Zonta Fair was \$10,039.20 and the Theatre Evening had net proceeds of \$1,217.00. Motion that the report be accepted J. Watt, seconded B. Young, carried.

9. Reports.

- 9.1 Membership. A request was made for lists of membership of all the current subcommittees from the various chairs as well as a request that members notify the committee when aware of other members who are unwell or otherwise potentially needing support.
- 9.2 Status of Women/Service Members were advised that the Service Group is looking closely at the ZISVAW grant scheme with a view to finding a suitable local partner with whom to apply for funds. The Advancement Grant has been widely circulated and the closing date is 15th October.
- 9.3 P.R.&C. The committee had held a very positive meeting generating raising ideas such as film evenings, the sale of left over goods from the Fair at other fair stalls, and working on the design of a display board to promote Zonta.
- 9.4 U.N. The meeting had not reached a quorum, however members should remember that U.N. Day happens in October.
- 10. Induction of new member Chris Christensen conducted the induction of new member Christine L. Stewart-Roberts and she was duly welcomed as the club's newest member.
- 11. Job Talk. Vivienne Hallman spoke about family which had included 12 foster children as well as her own. She currently teaches young people at University of Queensland in biology. Her interests are broad and include environmental issues and the empowerment of women.

- 12. Other Business. Lynette Liddle advised that a further \$340 had been realised on left over Fair merchandise. Members were advised that the Zonta Birthday would occur on 8th October and that eight clubs were interested in celebrating and raising funds and awareness together. Agreed that we should be involved next year. Elaine Varley advised that she would attend the Charter Dinner of the Pine Rivers Z Club. - 13. Special Business. Issues to be voted upon at Tamworth were presented by Elizabeth Fraser with appropriate explanation. Resolution 7. That the Federal Government develop a program of bone density testing for women entering menopause. **AGREED IN PRINCIPLE.**

Resolution 8 That the Federal Government put treatment for osteoporosis on PBS. **AGREED IN PRINCIPLE**

Resolution 9. That the Federal Government make child care tax deductible for all families. AGREED IN PRINCIPLE - Heather Mohay will provide some wording for a possible amendment.

Resolution 10. That income splitting be allowed in families where only one parent works outside the home. AGREE IN PRINCIPLE - Heather Mohay to frame possible amendment.

Resolution 11 That ZI produce a strategic management plan to increase efficiency and effectiveness. **AGREED.**

Resolution 12. That ZI should conduct performance evaluation on all Board Members and committee members annually. **AGAINST.**

Resolution 13 Congratulate Judy Lord and her Board for creating notions of good corporate governance. **AGREED**

Resolution 14. That clubs all establish Websites. AGREED WITH AN AMENDMENT THAT SITES BE LINKED.

Resolution 15 That clubs worldwide raise \$100,000 for a search for the wreckage of Amelia Earhart's plane. **AGAINST**.

Resolution 16. That the Cairns Club bid to host the 2006 ZI Conference. NEED TO KNOW MORE.

Resolution 17. Increase in membership fees for District 24 to \$26. AGAINST.

Resolution 18 Accumulated District Funds of \$50,000 be used to fund local projects. AGAINST.

Resolution 19. Insurance for members to be financed by a levy on members of approximately \$2.40 annually. AGREED.

Here is the third in our series.

Jessie Street (1889-1970) was one of the most active campaigners for women's rights in Aus-

tralia. She had a relatively privileged upbringing, attending school in England and residing at Women's College University of Sydney. She graduated BA in 1910. She was interested in women's issues from an early age, attending the International Alliance of Women's Conference in Rome in 1911 and in Geneva in 1914. In 1916 she was a co-founder with Annie Golding of NSW Social Hygiene Association and in November of that year gave the address "The place of treatment of venereal disease in social reform" at the Workers' Educational Association Sex Education Conference. (Just imagine a middle/ upper class woman doing that !!!)

Jessie Street campaigned vigorously for equal rights for women, equal pay, appointment of women to public office, election of women to parliament, social justice, Aboriginal rights. She was interested also in the plight of Jewish refugees and the question of peace. Her husband was Sir Kenneth Street, a Supreme Court Judge.

Of particular interest to Zonta (our ngo status at the UN) is that Jessie Street was the sole woman representative in the Australian delegation to the founding conference of the United Nations in San Francisco in 1945.

With other internationally known women, she was instrumental in (continued page 2)
