## General Information KwaYa Choir

KwaYa (Swahili word for choir) is a not for profit incorporated association, with charity status, founded by President, Marsha Gusti, based on the Gold Coast. The KwaYa Cross Cultural Connections Programme fosters, promotes and generates cross cultural partnerships between non-indigenous Australian singers, Australian indigenous groups and indigenous communities abroad. The music program aims to: boost widespread active community participation, focus on skills development for emerging artists, advance cultural diversity and preserve cultural heritage. Its rationale is to conjointly afford opportunities that provide linguistically and culturally relevant programs that strengthen and develop cultures and encourage social inclusion.

KwaYa provides unique opportunities to enable the non indigenous and indigenous Australian singing community to unite and work together on projects that make a difference to the lives of disadvantaged women and children in remote areas in Australia and abroad.

KwaYa has organised for numerous choirs from around Australia to visit Uganda in September 2011. They will depart Australia on 17 September, and tour for 12 days, performing their music. As part of the project, KwaYa members also help build resources - they plan to build a manual arts building at a local school.

Two Warwick women, Delphine Charles and Coral Brown, are participating in this KwaYa Choir. The Zonta Club of Warwick has donated \$200 to assist them in meeting the costs of this trip.
