## Jane M KlausmanAward

As we are about to award our 2012 Jane M Klausman scholarship at the June meeting it may be timely to remind members how this award came into being and who is eligible to apply.

## SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTION

Established in 1998 from a generous bequest by Jane M. Klausman, a member of the Zonta Club of Syracuse, New York USA, and the 1990-1995 Zonta International Parliamentarian, the Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship is awarded annually to women pursuing undergraduate or master's degrees in business management.

The program operates at the Zonta club, district and international levels. Zonta clubs provide awards for club recipients. Zonta International awards scholarships of US\$1,000 each at the district level and twelve international scholarships in the amount of US\$5,000 each. The Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarships are awarded annually and may be used for tuition, books or living expenses at any university, college or institution offering accredited business courses and degrees.

## ELIGIBILITY

Women pursuing a business or business-related degree who demonstrate outstanding potential in the field are eligible. Online students are also eligible. Members and employees of Zonta International or the Zonta International Foundation are not eligible to apply for the Scholarships.

## Project now

Work is continuing on the planning for the Breakfast Fundraising Event to be held on Wednesday 26 September for the funds required to build a $\$ 750,000$ purpose designed residence on land provided by the Salvation Army at Red Hill. Project now will provide accommodation for up to twenty women recovering from alcohol, drug and gambling addictions.

Amenya Reza from the Zonta Brisbane Metro Breakfast Club will be attending our June meeting to provide an update on the project and to provide an indication as to how our club can support these efforts. The
 key speaker for the breakfast has been selected who is an impressive woman and most relevant to the aims of the project. The corporate brochure has also been finalised and will enable organisations to be well informed about the project and need for support.

## Message from Trish Collins, District Governor

Trish Collins has sent an email to the club seeking Zontians to help Judi Hutchinson from Brisbane Metro Breakfast Club to bring together a group of women to form a committee to help organise the 1,000,000 Birthing kit Brisbane Celebration Breakfast on Friday August 17 and for a person to Chair this committee.

## "It is essential to find someone who would be willing to Chair this committee so the function can go ahe ad.

Judi Hutchinson is organising an Assembly Day on Saturday August 18 to be held by Brisbane Breakfast and Brisbane South clubs, where 10,000 kits will be made. The official 1,000,000th kit will be made at this Assembly day.

As you can imagine the running of a celebration 1,000,00th birthing kit breakfast will be a huge task and requires commitment from a group of Zontians who are willing to give their time and energy.

The Brisbane Breakfast and South clubs will already be stretched to the limits arranging this amazing Assembly day for 10,000 kits, so their clubs will have few volunteers able to assist in the breakfast. I understand that Judi has sent an email to your clubs previously but has not yet received any response. It would be a pity to not have a celebration breakfast in Brisbane, however, if there is no committee we can't hold one. This will be the biggest PR event that Zonta will be tied to Nationally. The potential for membership growth is there.

I ask that you provide this email to all club members and encourage them to assist with this celebration. Please ask interested members to email me as soon as possible so we can decide whether this celebration can go ahead."

## Easy Coconut Ice

## Ingredients

2 cups icing sugar
1 cup desiccated coconut
1teaspoon Vanilla extract or essence
1/2 teaspoon lemon juice
2 egg whites, lightly beaten
115 g copha
Pink or green food coloring

## Method

1. Place icing sugar, coconut, vanilla, lemon juice and egg whites into a large bowl.
2. Melt copha over gentle heat, allow to cool slightly.
3. Pour onto ingredients in bowl. Combine thoroughly.
4. Press half the mixture into a greased tray lined with baking paper
5. Add few drops of pink or green food colouring to remai ning mixture
6. Press firmly on top of white mixture
7. Refrigerate to set. Cut into squares

## 5 Cup Fruit cake

## Ingredients

I cup rolled oats, or breakfast cereal of chioce
1 cup sultanas or mixed fruit
1 cup Brown sugar
1 cup self raising flour
1 cup milk

## Method

1. Preheat oven to $\mathbf{1 6 0 - 1 7 0}{ }^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$
2. Mix together dry ingredients. Make well in centre and add milk.
3. Mix well and pour into a lined and greased loaf tin
4. Bake 45 minutes to an hour.
