Life after Young Women in Public Affaris Award

(Editor's Note: We received this update from Melissa Bell who was awarded the YWPA award by the Zonta Club of Warwick Inc in 2006. Great to keep in touch with these young women and to strengthen their bond with Zonta).

There is no doubt that 2006 was a very exciting year for me. I was ecstatic when I received the news that I had been selected as the recipient of Zonta's Young Women in Public Affairs (YWPA) award. It was a great honour to receive this accolade, and I believe that winning this award opened many doors for me, not to mention the financial assistance that the accompanying prizemoney offered.

Life after winning the YWPA award has been like a bustling roller coaster. After graduating from Assumption College Warwick with an OP score of 2, I was accepted into the University of Queensland to study a Bachelor of Speech Pathology. Moving to the "big smoke" was a very exciting, yet daunting adventure, and I was fortunate enough to be able to live on campus at Duchesne College, an all-girls catholic college, for three years of my studies. I used all of the prize money from the award to assist me with the move to Brisbane, and it was definitely money well spent! Duchesne provided a very supportive environment and it was a fantastic experience to form friendships with such warm, fun, intelligent, driven and like-minded young women.

Upon graduating from my course in 2010, I took on a six-week locum position at the Tweed Heads and Murwillumbah Hospitals in northern New South Wales. I thoroughly enjoyed working for NSW Health and my time at the hospital was a fantastic start to my career.

In February 2011, I accepted a job with the Royal Queensland Bush Children's Health Scheme (BushKIDS), based in Mount Isa. BushKIDS is a non-government organisation that provides free allied health services to young children in a number of rural and remote areas across Queensland. I enjoyed working for the organisation immensely and found the job to be extremely rewarding – the look on a child's face when they realise that they have achieved their goal, no matter how big or small, is absolutely priceless!

At the end of 2012, I made the decision to move on from BushKIDS, and further my career by taking a job with Central and North West Queensland Medicare Local based in Mount Isa, which is where I am currently employed. In my current position, I provide generalist speech pathology services to the remote indigenous communities in the Lower Gulf area of Queensland, including Mornington Island, Doomadgee, Burketown and Gregory. I see people of all ages, from babies, right through to the elderly, and have been fortunate enough to be exposed to the rich cultural history of these communities during these trips.

The Zonta Young Women in Public Affairs (YWPA) award is a wonderful scheme that provided me and no doubt many other young women, with opportunities and financial assistance to help set us on the road to achieving our dreams. I would like to thank Zonta for their support, and encourage all young women to apply for this award.
