Dee shares Asian Fruit in Lime Syrup with Yoghurt and Ginger Crush:

 $\frac{1}{2}$  each of deseeded Rockmelon, Honeydew and Watermelon

1 x 525gm can lychees in syrup - drained

1/2 pineapple, hard core removed and cut into 2 cm cubes

125 ml water

 $\frac{1}{2}$  cup caster sugar

- 2 teas finely shredded lime rind
- 1 tbsp of lime juice
- 1 cup low fat Vanilla yoghurt

8 ginger crunch cookies.

- Use a scoop to make melon balls.
- Place in a large bowl, add drained lychees and pineapple.
- Combine water, caster sugar, lime juice and rind in saucepan over low heat cook stirring for 3 mins or until syrup dissolves boil uncovered for 10 mins or until liquid thickens.
- Remove from heat and set aside for 15 mins to cool.
- Pour syrup over melon mixture and stir to combine.

• Spoon among serving dishes - top with dollop of vanilla yoghurt and sprinkle with crushed ginger cookies.

<u>The Annual Zonta Club of Warwick Bursary</u> has been awarded since 1998. It came into existence through discussions between our then Vice President, Karina Exaudi Larsen, and the Chaplains associated with the local Secondary Schools. The Chaplains were noticing that a number of worthy female students in Grade 10 were facing financial pressures about completing their Senior years and were failing to return to School for Grade 11. In order to overcome this situation, Zonta Club of Warwick Inc commenced the Zonta Bursary. The Bursary is awarded in Grade 11 and covers expenses over the final two years of education. It is administered by the student's own school and covers outlays like books, uniforms, excursions, etc. Applications are sought from students completing Grade 10 at District High Schools at Allora, Killarney and Warwick, and from private Schools like Assumption College, School of Total Education and Scots PGC College. The Bursary now has a value of \$750.00. This year's applications close on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> February 2013.

<u>The YWPA Award (Young Women in Public Affairs)</u> is a Zonta International Award. In Australia, we call for applications from mainly Grade 12 students, who demonstrate a solid commitment to their schools and communities through their volunteer work. The successful applicant is usually one who has strong leadership capabilities and a dedication to the advancement of the status of women.

The Award at Club level is valued at \$250. The winner's application then goes to District level and the winner there receives US \$1000. Ten International finalists are chosen and receive US \$4000 each.

Our Australia Day Breakfast Bush Poet, Carmel Wooding (nee Dunn) was our winner in 2000. Application forms are sent to Warwick State High School, SOTE, Scots PGC and Assumption College. This year's applications close on 15<sup>th</sup> March 2013.

As well as ensuring that members are fully informed about Zonta at an international level, this magazine is a valuable tool which can be utilised in the recruitment of new members and in increasing our visibility within the community.

The magazine is available from the ZI website (see the urls in the bottom righthand corner of the ZI home page - <u>http://www.zonta.org/</u>)

On 11th December, Zonta International celebrated 64<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the signing of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. It is a time to reflect on Zonta's

commitment to pursue equal rights, protections and opportunities under fair laws, including our pledge to strongly oppose violence against women. As part of our advocacy role, Zonta Clubs address some facet of violence against women - supporting women's shelter, attending DV vigils, sponsoring training for law enforcement or personal protection. 'Zonta says NO' campaign is about focusing on & gaining visibility for these efforts under one clear banner. One of the 2012-14 advocacy objectives is that "each club will take action on at least 1 advocacy event or issue each year, make such action visible, and report on the results to its Governor & ZI." It has been suggested that one of these two actions (in the biennium) be related to opposing violence against women.

Wonderful women: Warwick Zonta Club President Mavis Cooper, International Women's Day guest speaker Lady Barbara Jephcott and Zonta Young Women in Public Affairs winner Carmel Dunn celebrated international Women's Day at a breakfast yesterday.

Carmel Dunn was selected by our Club in 2000 for the Zonta International YWPA Award. At the time she was a final year student at Scots PGC. Carmel fulfilled all the requirements of that Award. She proved herself to be an active youth leader, an enthusiastic volunteer across many local projects, had a commitment to advance the status of women and was active in her School and its mentoring programs. She showed a deep concern for the issues that relate to the wellbeing of people and the communities in which they live and work. She was well known as a "Bush Poet" and was one of the youngest and most respected performers in the growing entertainment of the time - Bush Poetry. Carmel attended many of our functions during 2000 and performed at the "Riverside Rendezvous" Breakfast that we organised on the banks of the Condamine to raise funds for one of our early projects. She also attended the Zonta sponsored Alumnae Seminar at the University of Queensland with two of our members where she heard some of the most notable Australian women speak"
