ZONTA 3rd Biennial Conference District 22 (September 2013) VISIBLE + CREDIBLE = A VIABLE FUTURE

Jenny Loy and I attended this Conference and what a wonderful experience it was for both of us. We had previously been to Area 4 meetings but this was our first Conference. We arrived at our accommodation on Friday afternoon, and that evening caught up with the few people we knew for registration and the welcoming party.

Saturday morning started with the flag parade and conference opening, followed by the first business session. Ros Kinder (Bylaws Chairman) gave a brief outline of procedures and protocols and conducted the essential formal business of adopting the conference program, standing rules and minutes of the previous conference. Judith Anderson then gave her District Governor's report.

Trish Collins (Nominating Committee Chairman) presented the candidates for election for the next Biennial and the International Representative, Maria Stefanova from Bulgaria introduced a video message from Zonta International President, Lynn McKenzie.

Next we were treated to inspiring presentations by three young women: Shannon Scott (District winner of one of the international Jane M Klausman Scholarship for Women in Business in 2012), Sarah Newman (the 2012 District and international award winner) and Chloe Yap (our 2013 District winner). Following this was a video presentation from Jendi Kepple (an Australian Amelia Earhart Fellowship winner), followed by a live presentation from Liz Davenport on her Kimberley Girls Project and then Dr Joy O'Hazy (who founded the birthing kit project).

After lunch the session began with some of the essential business of the conference: financial reports, the budget for 2014-2016, motions and resolutions put forward by Clubs and the results of the election for the next board of District 22.

This necessary part of the conference was followed by Dr Shannon Spriggs who spoke on advocacy to reduce violence against women; her topic was "Whose business is it". Saturday's session was finished by Area 3 Director Amena Reza who led a discussion "Zonta says NO"

The dinner was a gala affair starting at 6.30pm with drinks, followed by an excellent three course meal, great company and surprise entertainment with a fashion parade by Liz Davenport. A silent auction was held during the evening and was a huge success.

Sunday morning started with a wonderful presentation by Carla Pearce (Lozang Tsultrim) who is a Buddist nun and spoke about our commitment to peace. Then Ros Kinder shared the story and successes of the Breast Cushion project over the many years since it has been established.

Denise Conroy, a former international advocacy chairman then spoke on "The Advocacy Jigsaw." Donna Foster (Pacific specialist) followed and opened our eyes to the reality hidden behind the images of Pacific paradise. After morning tea the session took us via You Tube to Zonta's program in Rwanda to reduce gender-based violence and eliminate mother-to-child HIV and then to Liberia where Zonta's fistula project has operated since 2008.

In the final session the conference was closed with a presentation by International Representative, Maria Stefanova, about service and advocacy in Europe where the issues and concerns are very different from ours in Australia.

Jenny and I left after lunch, after having experienced a most rewarding weekend.

Thirty four women supported this event, and as in previous years, everyone enjoyed the time at the craft fair (or retail therapy for some of us!) The raffle was well supported – sincere thanks to those who donated prizes (vouchers for Shelley's Craft Shop, bottles of wine, mystery gift). Leanne Ingram won the ticket to the Australian Day Breakfast, so we will be contacting her in January to provide information and encourage her to attend this event with a group of friends. This year the presentation focused on the Bursary (\$750 awarded to girl finishing Grade 10 to encourage her to continue secondary studies) – this was relevant to the theme of International Day of the Girl Child which had been

celebrated that week. According to my calculations, we raised \$413 (not meeting the target for the Bursary but hopefully we raised awareness of this less known local Zonta activity). Leanne will provide a full financial report at our next meeting.

We were very pleased to welcome guests Kathy Payne (our guest speaker), Sue Hamlet, Melissa March and Nola Roach.

That morning, some of our members joined in with approximately 80 others for the inaugural meeting (a breakfast) of the Women in Warwick (WOW) group - of which Sue is one of the organizing committee.

Jenny presented an overview of the International Day of the Girl Child, and was to include YouTube presentation (unfortunately some technical problems prevented this) – so Jenny encouraged us to go to the website ourselves. We then had the privilege of hearing from Kathy Payne, who shared the story of her son Aaron's past 12 months recovering from a hemispherectomy, before informing us of some of the programs she facilitates within the Warwick community.

Kathy talked of her experience working with girls aged 12-18 years (predominantly at Flexi School) and the success of the SHINE program, which is a self-development program which focuses on three principals WORTH, STRENGTH & PURPOSE. This program is also offered 4 times / year at Warwick State High School, and Stanthorpe State School is aiming to start SHINE programs with girls in primary school.

Kathy also informed us of the SPA: Spotlighting Parenting Adventure program targeting teenage pregnancy (she has worked on this program through Head Space), and a new initiative which Head Space is hoping to fund – Young Mum's Playgroup, catering for teenage mums who are disengaged from other social support networks.
