International Day of the Girl Child: 11 October 2013

Observance of this day provides an opportunity to raise public awareness of the different types of discrimination and abuse that many girls suffer. The theme for the 2013 International Day of the Girl Child is 'Innovating for Girls' Education'.

Examples of potential tools to innovate for and with girls to advance their education:

• Improving public and private means of transportation for girls to get to school—from roads, buses, mopeds, bicycles to boats and canoes

- Collaboration between school systems and the banking industry to facilitate secure and convenient pay delivery to female teachers and scholarship delivery to girls
- Provision of science and technology courses targeted at girls in schools, universities and vocational education programmes
- Corporate mentorship programmes to help girls acquire critical work and leadership skills and facilitate their transition from school to work
- Revisions of school curricula to integrate positive messages on gender norms related to violence, child marriage, sexual and reproductive health, and male and female family roles
- Deploying mobile technology for teaching and learning to reach girls, especially in remote areas
- Using traditional and social media, advertising and commercial packaging to publicise data on gender disparities in education, the underlying causes, and actions that can be taken for change

Our very best wishes to Louise who is recovering from surgery; she arrived home 25th September.

Lois has requested 6 months absence from Zonta, as her daughter Sarah has been diagnosed with breast cancer, and Lois will be busy supporting her through her treatment, and being available for her grandchildren. We wish Sarah all the best for her treatment.

Rhonda was busy at "Airing of the Quilts" on $5^{th} - 6^{th}$ October – this annual event raises funds for Breast Cancer and Prostate Cancer, as well as displaying many beautiful quilts made by very talented local women.

Jenny has been tripping around (lucky you!) and shares this holiday tale and photos:

'Mum and I set off to Broome by plane to join an APT guided tour of the Kimberley region. The bus travelled a total of 2,508 kilometres during our 8 day adventure. Most days the temperature reached 39 degrees and most days we did a walk of some sort. After the first day Mum decided to only do the walks that were very easy but there were few of them!

The first night in wilderness and 500 kilometres from Broome, Mum announced she had a "Bladder Infection". I wondered what on earth we would do but the young girl at the camp called the flying doctor. They did not visit, but Mum's symptoms were relayed to the doctor on the other end of the phone and then the camp locked medication chest was opened and the prescribed medication (antibiotic) was given to Mum.



We stayed in Glamping tents which had wooden floors with 2 proper beds and a proper shower, wash basin and toilet. They were in the middle of a station so during the night the cows came along chomping grass right outside the tent. We stayed 2 nights at Bell Gorge Camp (tent), 2 nights at El Questro (tent) and 2 nights at Bungle Bungle camp (tent) with 1 night at Fitzroy Crossing in a motel. At El Questro the little wallabies would hop on through the camp site in the night. All camps had a kitchen and deck where breakfast and dinner at

night were eaten. Most days' lunch was on the road to somewhere to see something. We would have little prepacked lunches and because Mum chose not to walk many walks we would pull up and she would take a book and sit under the covered picnic spots (with her lunch) that all had toilets attached. She never did read her book because many tours stopped at the same place and many people did not do the walks and she always had company.

I am pleased to say I did all the walks. Out of 14 of us travelling only 4 of us actually did all the walks as they were more like bush walking treks than just walks, and rough and tough going. We visited many Gorges and looked at lots of WOW factor spots in our travels but there was lots of travelling between these sights. All roads once off the bitumen were red dirt as far as the eye could see, and there was mostly dirt road travel.

Mum and I flew over the Bungle Bungles in a helicopter. I must confess I was very nervous. Mum hung on very tightly. There were no doors on the helicopter for better sightseeing purposes.

We heard a lot about aboriginal culture in our travels and about the formation of the Kimberley's area. It apparently was a piece of land that slammed into Australia many moons ago. Hence all the mountain ranges are coral reefs and the Boab tree grows there and it is only found in 2 other places -Africa and South America.



We arrived home very tired but very satisfied with what we had seen. We also enjoyed the company of the other people on the trip and everyone looked out for each other after just the first day together'.
