# Helen Lahey Orienteering Award 2015 Lynda Rapkins

#### **HELEN LAHEY**

On 8th September 1988, Jean Sinclair wrote to members of the Club about Helen Lahey...

"I am sorry if the news of Helen's death came to most of you as a great shock. But I was especially requested by Helen not to talk about her condition. In fact for the past few weeks she spoke mostly about her determination to get better and I never admitted to her my profound misgivings. Those of us who witnessed Helen's final days cannot repine and wish her back. But her courage and presence of mind were truly amazing to witness, as were her continual thoughts for others. One of her last conversations with me was about Zonta and her hopes that the club would turn its thoughts towards the international scene and be able to achieve something special while Leneen (Forde) was International President. I hope we can fulfill that wish".

Helen Lahey died 4th September 1988.

Helen loved orienteering, which is why the Club decided to give a prize in her name.

Lauren is a nurse from Birdsville, who has recently relocated to Brisbane to pursue a Doctor of Medicine program at UQ. She received a GPA of 6.0 in her first semester and has demonstrated significant financial need. The committee felt that Lynette would have been pleased to support a student from a rural background in fulfilling her goals in medicine.

### **NOVEMBER DINNER MEETING**



GUEST SPEAKER: Leila Abdukar

Leila presented a thought-provoking and candid exposé about her family's tragic flight from the 1991 Civil War in Somalia, through to her current activities in Australia.

Tragically, she witnessed the violent deaths of her father and brother; experienced the necessity of fleeing her home without material possessions or comforts; endured the daily disaffection of a refugee camp followed by the chaos of walking to the next country and the next refugee

camp. Within this environment she began what became a life-long commitment to volunteering when she organised writing and maths classes, (initially by using a stick in the dirt, then later with paper and pencils) for other children in the camps. During her formative years, she witnessed the dreadful death of a young girl caused by involuntary circumcision, and the births of many children, whose initial years and hence camp survival, depended upon the irregular goodwill of charitable organisations. Once the family finally reached Nairobi, Leila won a scholarship to Canada, but refused to leave her family, and in particular, her Mother.

Leila reached Australia on the 5<sup>th</sup> June 1997.

Leila has committed herself to speaking out about injustice – whatever its form. She directs much of her energy towards the non-profit sector assisting refugees and migrants, and in particular, women and young girls by helping them to realise, that through education, they can achieve dignity. She willingly undertakes this work, which often involves her publicising what she believes are abhorrent cultural values, ingrained prejudices and degrading practices. She feels that in taking such a stance, she is in some way, thanking those people who enabled her to become a productive and generous contributor within and to our society.

# **CLUB MEMBERS IN ACTION**

Jane Prentice, Federal Member for Ryan, spoke to promote Zonta and their campaign to end violence against women on an international scale.

"I have been a proud member of Zonta for many years and I am an advocate of our "Zonta Says NO" campaign... Part of this is our 16 Days of Activism, a campaign against gender violence," she said. "The campaign runs between 25 November (International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women) and 10 December (International Human Rights Day) to reinforce the message that violence against women is a human rights issue.

Mrs Prentice spoke on Day 6 of the campaign, which focused on human trafficking.

"You may wonder why I am talking about human trafficking in Australia in this day and age, in the 21st century, in 2015, but it is estimated that between 300 and 1,000 people a year in Australia are trafficked, and 80 per cent of them are women," she said.

"We all need to work to raise more awareness of these issues and all the issues affecting human rights and gender violence. 16 Days of Activism is an important campaign that does just that and I am proud of Zonta's advocacy for these issues. "Zonta says NO"."

Our speaker touched on some of her work, and discussed the complications associated with the continued practice of social, legal and cultural values within Australia, where such practices are illegal.




