Remember we now are paying the \$5 in our fees so we no longer pay at the meeting.

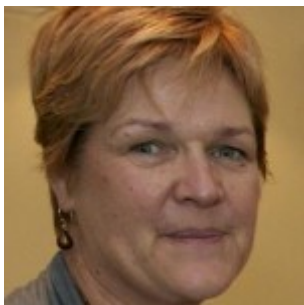

I was born at Esk in the Brisbane Valley and grew up on a farm in the small district of Bryden. My two brothers, my sister and I attended the little one teacher school where we made up about a quarter of the pupils. As there was no secondary school near Bryden I went to board at Ipswich Girls Grammar for four years and I still have lunch occasionally with some of those "girls". After Senior I went to UQ and then Kelvin Grove Teachers College.

My first teaching appointment was at Mitchell west of Roma—an eye opener for someone who had not been west of Toowoomba. After that I was transferred to Wandoan where I met my future husband, John, who was working for Elders. We married in 1965 and having done "country service" with the Education Department, I then did country service with Elders; Gympie, Goondiwindi, Injune, Wandoan, Chinchilla, and Nambour. We enjoyed those small country towns and they were a great place to bring up our three children - Scott, Michael and Catherine. I really appreciate what they have achieved and the way they support me. I am now delighted to have seven grandchildren who are a joy.

When the children were all at school I returned to teaching full time at Maroochydore High for nine years until we moved to Beaudesert in 1984. I taught at BSHS until I retired in 2000 after a serious illness.

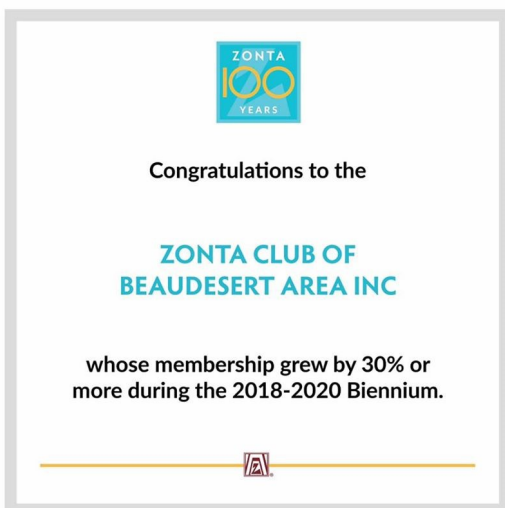
I have always been a very keen reader and my other interests are gardening and, to a lesser extent these days, sewing and quilting. Having joined U3A, I enjoy a number of their activities including Nordic walking to try and keep fit.

In 1988 I was a charter member of the newly formed Zonta Club and have held various positions including President and numerous terms as Treasurer. Through Zonta I have met many friends and have really enjoyed working on the various projects supporting the great work that Zonta does. I am not as involved now as I was in earlier days but I really appreciate belonging to the club and am delighted that it has so many great members and continues to grow. I think it plays an important role in the community.

John was diagnosed with Parkinson's in 2005 but before his health deteriorated we were able to have a number of great overseas trips.

My greatest challenge has been caring for John as his condition worsened. Being a carer is certainly demanding and exhausting. The support of some Zonta members was very much appreciated. Eventually he went to Wongaburra for a few months and died in November 2017.

And so, after 52 years of marriage here I am learning how to make my own way in the world.
