President's Patter

I attended the area meeting for incoming Presidents of the Zonta clubs on Sunday 7th August and was pleased to see that our club is doing very well. The Brisbane clubs have a number of membership challenges due to so many clubs meeting in the city and not being attached to a suburb or local area. The Breakfast club runs its committee meetings almost entirely via email and use periodic direct debit for the dinner fees or if members don't attend, then the administration fee is charged. Interestingly, their club raised \$45,000 for birthing kits and completed 15,000 of these kits in the past year.

The Noosa club raised \$36,000 in 10 days with their recycled fashion in a 'pop-up' shop. Apparently the ladies have no designer clothes, shoes or bags left!

Flyers for the Race Day on 16th October will be circulated shortly and the plans for the 'Fire and Ice' cocktail party for IWD in March are looking spectacular, thanks to Lynette and her team.

So much work on the RISE project has been going on behind the scenes. The Advocacy committee has worked frantically to complete an application to the Gaming Fund for fixtures and fittings for the house. A number of letters have been prepared to go to politicians and some 'bloody difficult' women in the community but are on hold while sensitive discussions go on between the politicians. Negotiations are complete with Coast2Bay regarding tax-deductible donations to RISE but to do this, they need to be the lead agency on the flyers as they are a registered charity that can provide tax receipts. A bold slogan has been chosen; '\$90,000 in 90 days' as this is what is needed to get the house built and finished. By making donations tax deductible, business and individuals are more likely to give generously. It is hoped that the flyers can go to the My Preview luncheon, Gary Crick lunch, Zonta Race Day, Caloundra Chamber of Commerce function and newsletter and that we can get some prominent women to promote our cause.

It is also hoped that with a bit of public pressure, the government may be persuaded to grant some funds to RISE. Apologies to those who brought wine or beer at the last meeting. A price of \$5 for house wine and beer had been negotiated but the wait staff was not aware of this when I spoke to them on the night.

This month's Member Profile introduces Chris Adler



I was born in Cootamundra, a small town in the central west of NSW. When I was 11 we moved to Sydney where my parents thought that my brother and I would gain a better education and more opportunities. I graduated from Turramurra High School and subsequently enrolled at the University of NSW to achieve a degree in Science, but due to illness, never completed my degree. Always loving maths, I took a position as an accounts assistant and was involved in the transition of accounts to a computerised system. This was when I discovered an interest and talent for data entry, computer operations and later, programming.

I then married and to support my husband in a business venture moved with my family back to the country, owning and operating motels for 5 years. It was over that period that my first 3 children were born, 2 boys and a girl. We then returned to Sydney, owning and operating a retail business before I had the opportunity to return to IT, becoming the Data Processing Manager with a Commercial Shipping Company. Unfortunately my first marriage ended.

I later remarried my soulmate and we have now been together for 25 years. This was followed once again, by going in to business for ourselves writing software and providing information solutions to companies in the transport industry. In 2003 Warren and I made the decision to move closer to our families, with parents on both sides becoming unwell, so we moved to Grafton on the North Coast of NSW and bought a retail/wholesale Fruit & Vegetable Market. Our 2 sons were born 17 months apart soon after. This made us a real Brady Bunch, Warren having 2 children, a boy and a girl from a previous marriage coupled with my 3 and then our own 2. We had a total of 5 boys and 2 girls, but only ever had 5 living with us at once as Warren's 2 children were older and still living in Sydney.

We relocated our business to Woolgoolga (26klms north of Coffs Harbour) and later sold it in 2004 after 10 years. I then moved into the Health Industry, first as a receptionist and later as the Practice Manager for a Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeon. I still remain working for him as a contract bookkeeper, as I also do, for 3 other medical specialists who, with him, own a large specialist medical centre in Coffs Harbour.

My husband remained in the retail industry after our business was sold, but due to the business that he worked for, going in to liquidation in 2012, we made a decision to bring forward our retirement plans to move to the Sunshine Coast where we had enjoyed our holidays since 2006. All our children had grown up and moved on and we no longer needed to rumble around a big house on our own. We moved to Caloundra and both gained work very quickly, my husband working in a Management Position at IGA Maleny and myself after a short term position with an Orthopaedic Surgeon and a 2 year stint as an Office Manager in General Practice accepted the position as Practice Manager at Coastal Cancer Care in March this year.

We have just celebrated the birth of our 14th and 15th grandchildren, love spending time with our enormous family and love reading, walking, camping and travelling. We have now commenced a transition to retirement cutting back to working just 4 days per week and are both committed to volunteering and assisting in the community.
