

The Zonta Birthing Kit Committee transferred to the Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia) in April 2007. The Zonta Birthing Kit Committee members all became Directors of the Foundation.

The project has grown from 100 kits to PNG in 1999 to over 340,000 kits to 30 countries during the period 2004-2007. Over 90 of the 113 Zonta Clubs in Australia held Assembly Days.

Efforts for burns victims recognised

The woman who helped establish Queensland's skin bank for burns patients has been named Maroochy's Citizen of the Year in the Australia Day awards.


Trish Littler became involved in the project in 1994, after members of the Palmwoods Rural Fire Brigade suffered serious burns when they became caught in a firestorm.

Under Trish's leadership as president, the Zonta Club adopted the skin bank as its area service product. Her vision and persistent lobbying won the support of Zonta Clubs throughout South-East Queensland and northern New South Wales.

Trish has also been treasurer, president and secretary of the Palmwoods CWA, and has served in various other executive roles. She works annually for the Red Cross Calling appeal, was a member of the Rotary-based Inner Wheels Club of the Sunshine Coast and worked on the Mary Murray Welfare Committee.

Maroochy Council has presented five individual achievement Australia Day Awards, with Reed Charity Foundation founder Harry Reed and Sunshine Coast Health Foundation Board chairman Mike Kelly both being recognised for community service.

- * UNIFEM Goodwill Ambassador Nicole Kidman invited her guests to make their wedding gift a donation to UNIFEM Australia.
- * In 2006/07, membership income rose by 27%, donations by 28% and income raised through IWD events increased by 87%. UNIFEM Australia was granted special consultative status with the UN Economic & Social Council (ECOSOC).
- * Two Afghan students successfully completed their studies at Australian Universities and returned to Afghanistan.
- * UNIFEM Austsralia gave A\$100,000 to the UN Trust Fund to End Violence Against Women and were invited to participate in the selection process for Trust Fund projects in East and South East Asia.
- * UNIFEM Australia sent A\$100,000 to UNIFEM for a UNIFEM Pacific project.
