While I am an import to Bowen I have lived here longer than anywhere else including my childhood home. I was raised and schooled in Maryborough at Albert State School....

And later at Maryborough Girls' State High School which was quite unique for a state school. It became co-educational the year after I completed senior. I was drawn to the maths and sciences but chose to study Human Movements at Queensland University basically because it was a conscious effort not to do medicine. I was neither following in my sister's footstep nor was I making callouts at all hours of the night. The irony of that is that I have five children and I still, even fifteen years out of baby stage, have a four hourly sleeping pattern.



We were very involved with sport and managed to survive my entire school life without a phone at home or a television.



My first years of teaching were spent in Mareeba before being transferred to Bowen in 1980. I met Robbie at the Bowen River Rodeo in June of that same year and we were married in April of the following year. Needless to say I have never been back to the rodeo since.



When my first child was born, I used to teach Physical Education one day a week at the old St Mary's school(s). I used to take him with me in the pram and was never short of babysitters. appropriate career choice as work was always there when I wanted it and each time I returned, it was in a different capacity. A change is as good as a holiday.
