#### Australia: "Room for improvement"

In January, for the first time in 10 years, Australia appeared before the committee monitoring the Convention on the Elimination of all forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW), reporting on its progress in the elimination of discrimination against women. Read the report and the United Nations comments on areas where Australia should improve.

#### Taking to the waves

In March 2006 Amnesty International Australia partnered with human rights organisation ICRAF in Papua New Guinea to host an International Women's Day event near Port Moresby, in which a canoe carrying a "Stop Violence Against Women" sail took part in a traditional canoe race.

#### New online partner

Amnesty International has joined with the <u>International Museum of Women</u> to host an online project for young women aimed at empowerment and positive change. Responding through photography, painting, poetry and prose the project asks young women all over the world to answer the question: "what defines your generation?"


