Rhonda hands Cheryl Throssell Vice Chair of the Bowen Community Council a cheque.





The green turtle is one of the threatened species which are on the adoption program. This is not only a fun and unusual gift, but the

The adoption is symbolic, it does not support one particular animal, and it helps fight the threats faced by species like these, threats such as land clearing, climate change, invasive plants, feral animals, marine and water pollution.

What To Do With All Those **Ripening Mangoes**?

This is an easy recipe liked by all, especially children in hot weather.

Mango Weiss Bars



1 cup sugar 1 cup water 1 ¼ kg peeled and sliced mangoes 1 tablespoon lemon juice 300 ml thickened cream

Place sugar and water in a saucepan and stir over low heat until sugar dissolves. Bring to boil and boil for 5 minutes or until syrup thickens slightly. Cool to room temperature.

Blend mangoes and lemon juice with syrup until smooth. Combine 1 cup of mango mixture with cream but do not beat. Put cream mixture in a foil lined container and freeze. When firm place mango mixture on top and freeze again. Cut into slices and keep in freezer.

Optional - Chopped Macadamia nuts can be added to the mango cream mixture.

Mangoes are a highly nutritious food, very high in beta carotene, Vitamin C and fiber which can help:

- aid digestion •
- lower cholesterol
- reduce risk of heart disease, cancer, high blood pressure and stroke.
