

It was with great pleasure that Zontians welcomed guest speaker Inspector Virginia Nelson to the October dinner meeting. Virginia addressed the meeting regarding her policy of empowering woman within the ranks of the police force. She has also been very active in the community, working with all concerned groups who work towards eliminating violence against women. Virginia recently won an *Excellence in Leadership Award*.

The following article was published in the Morning Bulletin on 11 August 2014.

Excellence in Leadership – Inspector Virginia Nelson

Last Friday, August 8, Inspector Virginia Nelson, currently the Capricornia District City Patrol Group Inspector, won the award of "Excellence in Leadership" for her committed leadership both within the community and from an internal perspective.

Inspector Nelson is a dedicated leader and is committed to building a resilient community through collaborative approaches to policing. She is also highly motivated in terms of furthering the development of regional women in policing.

Inspector Nelson has been a driving force behind significant collaborative proactive tactics to combat a burgeoning Domestic Violence problem in Capricornia District. Through Inspector Nelson's actions, the shared power of multiple agencies were marshalled in a two day Domestic Violence Forum. Participants committed to a Domestic Violence Steering committee which ultimately led to a dedicated services 'hub' to provide coordinated approaches to better service domestic violence clients in Rockhampton.

Further, since early 2014 Inspector Nelson garnered support from senior management to push forward with a range of specialist programs aimed at the development of female QPS staff in regional areas. Her unique communication skills and capacity to create confidence in individuals has led to strong buy in of programs created to address gender imbalance in the QPS work force.

Many thanks to the girls from National Australia Bank who also provided toiletries and helped to put the packs together.


Consequently 116 packs are now ready for delivery to the Women's Shelter.

DISTRICT 22 HISTORY:

The first Zonta Club in Australia was established in 1929 in Sydney and included Australian poet, Dorothea Mackellar, among its members. While the Club disbanded in 1935, a Canadian Zontian, Dorothy Thompson, reintroduced Zonta International in Australia and New Zealand in 1965 with the organization of 12 Clubs, one in each Australian capital city and five in New Zealand. These Clubs became **District 16** of Zonta International.

By 1990, the number of clubs in District 16 had grown to the extent that, at the Zonta International Convention in Dallas in 1990, District 16 was divided into 3 separate Districts: **District 16** (New Zealand), **District 23** (Victoria, Tasmania, Western Australia, South Australia, and the Northern Territory), and **District 24** (Queensland, New South Wales, and the Australian Capital Territory).

Further growth in Clubs and membership led to a decision at the 2008 Zonta International Convention to divide District 24 into two Districts: **District 22** (Queensland and the Northern Rivers of New South Wales) and **District 24** (the remainder of New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory).

District 22 has 43 Clubs from Cairns in the North and Mount Isa and Longreach in the west to Lismore in the Northern Rivers of New South Wales.

The District has more than 1100 active and engaged members including two former International Presidents of Zonta International: Leneen Forde AC who served for the 1990-1992 biennium; and Mary Magee OAM who served for the 2000-2002 biennium.

DISTRICT 22 STRUCTURE:

District 22 is one of 32 Zonta International Districts worldwide, each of which is managed by a District Board elected by delegates to a biennial District Conference.

District Boards are supported by a number of Committees as required by the Zonta International Bylaws.


All positions are voluntary, with elected officers (Board members) and appointed Committee Chairmen holding office for a period of two years.

District 22 is divided into 5 Areas, each with an elected Area Director who provides guidance and support to the Clubs in the Area and organizes an annual Area Meeting for those Clubs.


Club structures mirror the District Board structure with a Club President and Board elected by the Club membership and supported by a Club Committee system. All Club members are expected to be active on at least one Club Committee.

Club and Board meetings are monthly with Committees expected to meet monthly in addition to the regular Club meeting.
