HIV/AIDS: How big is the problem?

According to the United Nations, AIDS is now the number one overall cause of death in Africa and is fourth among all causes of death worldwide. More than 40 million people are infected with HIV/AIDS.

An estimated 40 million people are infected with HIV; 25 million in sub-Saharan Africa.

Worldwide, half of all persons living with HIV/AIDS are women; in sub-Saharan Africa, the figure is 58 percent.

The majority of those infected with HIV/AIDS are working age (15 to 49), the mainstay of families, communities, enterprises and economies.

The gender differential in HIV infection is especially wide with respect to young men and women aged 15 to 24; two-thirds of infections are among young women.

There is ample evidence that the high and increasing vulnerability of women to HIV in Africa is due to:

Gender-based economic inequalities;

Sexual violence in homes, the workplace and other social spheres, including schools; and

Lack of access to prevention, education and training, and care.

International Service

Helping women in developing countries has been a passion of Zontians since the organization was founded in 1919. From 1923 when Zontians aided relief efforts for women and children in Turkey to 2001, when Zontians urged support of projects to benefit women in Afghanistan, more than US\$6 million has been disseminated to projects in countries as far reaching as Afghanistan, Argentina, Bangladesh, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Botswana, Brazil, Burkina Faso, Childe, Colombia, Comoros Islands, Egypt, Ghana, Guatemala, India, Mexico, Nepal, Niger, Nigeria, Philippines, Senegal, Sierra Leone, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Togo, Uruguay and Zimbabwe.

Mission

The mission of the Zonta International Foundation is to support the charitable and educational programs of Zonta International through effective fundraising, investment of funds, and the distribution of proceeds. Through its financial support of Zonta International programs, the Foundation becomes the catalyst for greater service to women throughout the world.

- Human trafficking is a \$9.5 billion a year business.
- □ The U.S. government estimates, each year, up to 800,000 people are taken from their homes and families and forced across international borders. Millions are trafficked within their own countries.
- 80% are women and girls.
- □ Nearly **20,000 people** are trafficked into the United States alone each year.
- ☐ The UN Population Fund estimates that globally **2 million girls** between the ages of 5 and 15 years are trafficked, sold or coerced into prostitution annually.

08 March is International Women's Day & Zonta Rose Day

One day each year, women and Zontians from around the world have a very special reason to celebrate: International Women's Day and Zonta Rose Day on 08 March.

The United Nations established International Women's Day in 1977 to celebrate the rights of women and international peace. However, the history of the day stretches back to the early 1900s, when women around the world were fighting for their rights. Women's organizations used the day to rally support for their causes: from the universal suffrage movement, to the protest of poor working conditions.

Today, women and men spend the day reflecting on women's progress in many ways.

In the months leading up to March, Zonta Clubs are encouraged to create annual events that will:

- □ Celebrate progress made and outline future steps to improve women's equality;
 - □ Unite women's organizations to encourage collaboration;
 - □ Generate contributions for the Zonta International Foundation Rose Fund;
 - Create visibility for the organization.
