MEMBERSHIP MATTERS... (From Zonta International – OMC Committee). **For Zonta Clubs.**

2008-2010 CLUB SERVICE / ADVOCACY PROJECTS

What is your club doing? The best way to recruit new members and keep them is to have meaningful and worthwhile service and advocacy projects that support the goals of Zonta International. After all, we tell prospective members that the work of Zonta is to enhance the status of women. So what better way to do that than to undertake local club projects that encompass the spirit and focus of Zonta International. After all, we are Zontians and proud of it!

Women join Zonta because it offers more than a local service organization. Zonta offers exciting international projects carried out through the United Nations. To encourage participation and involvement by Zontians, a local club should also undertake interesting projects that carry out the themes of our international service projects. This includes the ZISVAW projects: women's health, education, and prevention of violence against women. These are the topics that caught the interest of our members when they first joined. A quick look at our international biennial goals will provide many more ideas for a club's efforts. Zonta International's Resolutions adopted at convention provide advocacy issues for a club to address; the ZI position papers provide further information and guidance for advocacy efforts. Of course, the ZI scholarship programs are terrific service projects because they are both local and international, and all the resources needed for them are on our ZI Web Site, www.zonta.org, as are materials on the international projects and resolutions.

Other sources of ideas for club projects can come from **district resolutions** adopted at district conferences. **Dates of importance**, such as the 16 Days of Activism and Women's Equality Day, can also be the basis for exciting club projects. Since many women have never heard of these dates before joining Zonta or have been unaware of such problems as obstetric fistula or genital mutilation, they will value Zonta more for the learning opportunities that membership brings to them. Learning experiences bring many feelings of satisfaction and accomplishment, in addition to the project itself.

Finally, the **member's interests must be considered** in choosing a successful and **Zonta mission-focused club project**. This means that members should have input into the initial selection of possible projects, input into choosing a project, and of course input into their role in the project. When members feel their opinions are valued, they will value Zonta even more.

A useful tool to assist a club in choosing a Zonta mission-focused project is found on our Web Site under Leadership->Committees->Legislative Awareness and Advocacy (LAA)->Advocacy/ Service Project Scorecard. The **Advocacy/Service Project Scorecard** helps a club identify which proposed projects relate to a Zonta goal. Let's pick the right projects to emphasize our uniqueness and to keep our members' interest and enthusiasm.
