Zonta on the Rocks – Advancing the Status of Women Worldwide

What are the programs of Zonta International? (From the ZI Website)

Zonta International's service and advocacy programs focus on improving the educational, health, economic, professional and political status of women. They include:

The <u>Amelia Earhart Fellowship Program</u> supports graduate study by women in aerospacerelated sciences and engineering. Since 1938, Zonta has awarded 1,052 Fellowships totaling over US\$5 million to women representing 57 countries. The Program is funded by voluntary contributions to the Zonta International Foundation Amelia Earhart Fellowship Fund.

The <u>Michael J. Freeman Scholarships for Irish Women Program</u> has provided over US\$864,000 in educational scholarships and vocational training for 250 women in Ireland since 1988. The Program is funded from a bequest made to the Zonta International Foundation by Irishman Michael J. Freeman.

The Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship Program encourages women preparing for careers in business management. Since 1998, 102 scholarships have been provided to women in 22 countries. The Program is funded from a bequest to the Zonta International Foundation by Jane M. Klausman, and voluntary contributions.

The <u>**Young Women in Public Affairs Program</u>** recognizes young women committed to leadership in public policy, government, and volunteer organizations. Since 1990, 311 awards have been made to young women in 35 countries. The Program was initially funded by investment income from the Zonta International Foundation Endowment Fund; today, it is funded by voluntary contributions to the Foundation YWPA Fund.</u>

The Zonta International Strategies to Eradicate Violence Against Women (ZISVAW) <u>Program</u> focuses on prevention, awareness, education and the development of innovative approaches to eliminating violence against women. The Program is funded by voluntary contributions to the Zonta International Foundation ZISVAW Fund.

The <u>International Service Program</u> addresses critical women's issues in developing countries. Since 1956, Zonta has provided more than US\$6million for projects in more than 25 countries. The Program is funded by voluntary contributions to the Zonta International Foundation International Service Fund.

Citizenship: Australia

Proposed Program: University of Queensland, Ph.D., Mechanical and Space Engineering

> Ms. Capra is investigating atmospheric spacecraft re-entry. Her research is focused on experimental simulations of the heating events experienced by hypersonic vehicles. Her goal is to demonstrate the ability of ground based facilities to correctly simulate the heating environment and to measure radiative heat transfer using these ground based facilities. She hopes that knowledge of these heating environments will lead to increased spacecraft safety and decreased cost.

She is interested in photography, travel and outdoor activities. She was a member of the Girl Guides for 12 years.

Citizenship: Australia

Proposed Program: University of Queensland, Ph.D., Mechanical and Space Engineering

Ms. Suvorovs' field of study involves the combustion of metallic material in oxygen-enriched atmospheres. Understanding the flammability of these materials is essential for the safety of space systems. Some of her tests will take place using the University of Queensland's drop town to simulate microgravity. Additional experiments will involve various sample configurations and test pressures.
