International Day of Peace 19th September





I was very fortunate earlier this year to visit the town of Cowra in NSW.

Cowra was the site of a prisoner of war camp during the Second World War which was famous for the 'Cowra Breakout' during which 231 prisoners and 4 Australian guards were killed.

Cowra features many monuments and memorials to soldiers of all nations. However, there is particular emphasis on Australian soldiers at the Cowra War Cemetery and on those soldiers who were held as prisoners of war at Cowra at the Japanese War Cemetery.

The action of the local RSL Branch in caring for the graves in the Japanese War Cemetery in Cowra, led to peaceful links being established between Australia and Japan.

It is the only Japanese War Cemetery to be retained in Australia.

The Australian World Peace Bell is proudly displayed in the town.
Usually erected in a nation's capital city, the bell was awarded to Cowra for the town's long standing contribution to world peace.
