Compilation of Birthing Kits: 17 May 2014

Sally advises that our boxes of 1000 birthing kits have been sent on to the Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia) ready for distribution. Here are some of our members packing assembled kits into the boxes; Jen-Rose Holmes, Jenny Loy, Louise Cox and Leanne Olsen. Members will be aware that The Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia) was born out of the Zonta Birthing Kit Project, which originated with Dr Joy O'Hazy a member of the Zonta Club of Adelaide Hills, and the inaugural assembly day held in 1999, resulted in 100 kits being sent to PNG. Over the next 5 years, the project grew slowly, but when AusAID funding was received and with support from the 114 Zonta Clubs in Australia, there was a dramatic increase. By 2006, the Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia) was created, maintaining close links with Zonta. The project has ongoing support from 3 Zonta Districts in Australia - D 23 ongoing since 2003; D 24 ongoing since 2005 and D 22 ongoing since 2009. Assembly days are an opportunity for prospective members to meet our Zonta organization with a hands on project that actually saves lives and suffering.


