## Aussie Camino journey: walking 165km

Our editor asked me to write about my experience of trekking the Aussie Camino in August. As pilgrim number 2021241 on the Camino from Portland Victoria to Penola South Australia, I would recommend participation. The Camino is a spiritual journey focusing on a particular person whose life and work provide fulfilment and satisfaction and a model for followers. The life of Mary MacKillop, Australia's first saint, Mary of the Cross, is a perfect study of a woman who carried many crosses in her life to respond to the challenges such as being a woman in control of her religious order (not the usual practice within the Catholic church patriarchy), travel to Rome to seek Papal permission for her Rule for the religious order she founded, excommunication for insubordination and the continual response to the poor and marginalised. A woman that Zonta



would have supported in her journey against gender and religious discrimination.











The Camino appropriately starts at Portland, where Mary gained her teaching experience. At Bayview Christian College we visited the section of the school that was a home for Mary and her family. The trek commenced following the Great South West Walk along the south coast of Victoria. Walking along cliffs and isolated coastal beaches for the first three days, we saw seal colonies and magnificent scenery of the coastline. Once arriving in Port MacDonnell, South Australia, the trek followed stock routes and disused rail tracks north to Penola. From Port MacDonnell through Mount Gambier, Bush Haven and Kalangadoo, the walk was flat with the only challenge the electrified fences. Arriving at Penola after a trek of 165km in seven days, we visited the original location of the first school that Saint Mary of the Cross and Catholic priest, Julian Tension Woods, established the first school for the isolated bush



children of Penola. The Mary MacKillop Centre at Penola is an interpretative exhibition of the work of Mary and Woods. When Mary MacKillop and Julian Tenison Woods made their dream a reality, 'Little did either of us then dream of what was to spring from so small a beginning.' Mary MacKillop 1891.













To sum up, no blisters, challenging myself physically and spiritually. Great experience. And how exciting to commence the journey of the Feast Day of St Mary of the Cross, August 8<sup>th</sup>.
